After a challenging 2016 campaign, the Missouri State softball team enters the 2017 season with renewed energy and excitement as the team brings back 14 student-athletes and welcomes four newcomers to the squad.

"This is a really good group of young women," head coach Holly Hesse said. "They work hard every day, have great team chemistry and they're just a joy to work with. It's going to be exciting to see what this group can accomplish because based on their work ethic, their attitude and the talent that we have, I think it's going to be an exciting year."

The Pitchers

The Missouri State pitching staff looks to have a successful year in the circle, where one veteran and two new faces will lead the Bears.

Junior **Kaitlin Beason** is the lone pitcher returning from the 2016 season. The hard-throwing right-hander saw 17 starts last season and led the staff with a 3.39 ERA over 117.2 innings of work. An eight-game winner, Beason tossed her first complete game against Detroit Mercy and hurled two shutouts while producing offensively for the Bears as well. The power hitter lifted eight out of the park to complement her .246 batting average over the course of the season.

Accompanying Beason is junior college transfer **Holly Kelley** and freshman **Erin Griesbauer**, who will help share the pitching workload.

Kelley joins the staff after playing two seasons at Hutchinson Community College, where she was named a NJCAA and NFCA JC Division II Second-Team All-American. Earning All-Jayhawk Conference first team honors last season, she threw two no-hitters, a perfect game and tallied 262 strikeouts – the third most in the nation. In the batter's box, Kelley blasted 13 home runs and tallied a team-high 70 hits while maintaining a .438 batting average.

"We're very excited about Holly," said Hesse.
"She's looked great this fall and in practice. She will come in and immediately help us in the eight-foot circle. She has a tremendous rise-ball and throws the ball hard. She has great composure and has been a great addition to our team. She also swings the bat pretty well so she'll be able to help us on both sides."

One of three freshman on the squad, Griesbauer gained valuable experience over the fall season. The newcomer comes to the program from Blue Springs

South High School where she was a three-time all-district and all-state academic standout. The Blue Springs, Mo., native accumulated 228 strikeouts during her junior and senior seasons. Griesbauer will also help the Bears at the plate and on the base paths. In her final two seasons, she carried a .401 batting average and earned 24 RBIs.

"Erin is our freshman pitcher, she throws the ball hard and is very competitive on the mound," Hesse added. "She is adjusting to this level of play but she continues to learn, grow and develop every day. She's also a left-handed hitter with a lot of options at the plate and great speed on the bases."

With three different options in the circle this season, Hesse said she looks forward to the pitchers bringing toughness and excitement to the defense.

"We expect our pitchers to do one of two things for us, either be so dominating that they can win the game or be dominating enough to keep us in the game," Hesse explained. "I think we have the kind of pitching staff that, in times, will dominate certain lineups. However, for consistency, the goal of the pitchers is to throw strikes and to keep us in the game so we can have a chance to win."

The Infield

Also giving the Bears a chance to win is a core group of senior infielders Elena Gambill, Mary Stephens and Bethany Sullinger.

Gambill racked up 30 hits over the 2016 season, lifting a pair of home runs out of the park. The everyday third baseman saw improvement from the 2015 season, raising her batting average to .256 and slugging percentage to .342 while earning the highest on-base percentage on the team.

Returning to the field from an injury in 2015, Sullinger saw time at the hot-corner in her 18 starts of the 2016 season.

Earning 50 starts in 2016, Stephens tallied 35



hits along with 24 RBI during the 2016 season. The veteran first baseman is a key part of the MSU offense and defense, launching seven home runs and accumulating 226 putouts on the field.

The Outfield

The Bears also return senior and 2016 All-MVC first team selection **Olivia Roark**. As a junior she successfully transitioned to the outfield while leading the Bears at the plate with a careerhigh .373 batting average. Roark saw great improvement over the last season, raising her batting average .151 points from her sophomore campaign.

Joining Roark in the outfield is Hannah Heinrichs, Sara Jones, Hailee Vigneaux and everyday center fielder Erika Velasquez Zimmer.

Zimmer went a team-high 13-for-15 on the base paths and racked up 30 hits on the season. Last season, the outfielders com-

bined for a .981 fielding percentage and 225 putouts.


Key Returnees

Allie Alvstad, Darian Frost, Morgan Greenlee, Kyana Mason and Madison Jones also return to the lineup for Missouri State. Jones finished the 2016 season with an improved batting average from 2015, tallying a team and career-high 43 hits while earning seven extra-base hits. The then-sophomore was untouched on the base paths, stealing a perfect five bases on the season.

"We have a lot of lefties who are triple threats, so that is very exciting," Hesse noted. "At any time, we could have five or six lefties in the lineup. We also have a good combination of hitters who hit the ball with power. All of those athletes can put a good bat on the ball and either put it through one of the gaps or drive it out of the park. I love our combination of lefties, who can do multiple things at the plate, and the power hitters in the middle of the lineup.

"Associate Head Coaches Sue Frederick and Beth Perine have really been working on our hitting, which is an area that we needed make the biggest strides this year. They've done a great job of breaking it down

and making sure our players have fundamentally sound swings and making sure we're getting the number of cuts we need."

The Newcomers

Along with newcomers Kelley and Griesbauer, Missouri State welcomes a pair of freshman utility players that will help make an immediate impact on the team.

The second freshman joining the Bears is Defiance, Mo., native Darby Joerling. She will assist the Bears in both the infield and outfield, as well as the left side of the batter's box. A four-year starter at Francis Howell, Joerling helped lead her team to two district championships and picked up first-team all-conference and all-district honors as a senior after carrying a .567 batting average and going 19-for-19 in stolen bases.

The final newcomer for the 2017 Bears is freshman Carsten Warner. At Nevada High School, she earned four first-team all-district honors, as well as a pair of first team-all conference honors. Warner brings a big bat to the MSU lineup after blasting 18 home runs and bringing in 126 runs, which was the eighth-most career RBI in the state of Missouri.

"For the younger players, their first year is about learning, growing and developing and I feel like they've really taken that to heart," Hesse said. "The underclassmen push the starters to be better every day and that has definitely been translating onto the field."

Preseason Poll

Missouri State was picked to finish in a seventh-place tie with Bradley in the MVC Preseason Coaches Poll. The Drake Bulldogs were selected as the 2017 preseason favorite, followed by Wichita state and Southern Illinois. UNI earned fourth-place rankings while Illinois State and Evansville were separated by one point in the fifth and sixth spots. The Bears and Bradley Braves tied for seventh while Indiana State and Loyola rounded out the pack.





State (Apr. 20) ... Belted a three-run home run at Northern Iowa and scored twice (Apr. 23) ... Drew a walk and went 2-for-3 with a run scored in series finale at UNI (Apr. 24) ... Blasted a grand slam at Wichita State (May 3) ... Hit an RBI double and scored in MVC Tournament win over Bradley (May 12) ... Singled and scored against Southern Illinois in MVC Tournament quarterfinals (May 13).

2015 (Sophomore)

Started 42 of the 48 games she played in during the 2015 season ... Batted .221 with 11 runs batted in ... Was second on the team with 23 bases on balls ... Was successful on both stolen base attempts on the season ... Drew a walk in back-to-back games to conclude the Louisiana Tech Invitational (Feb. 7-8) and scored a run against the host LA Tech ... Belted a three-run home run to centerfield in the first inning against Samford in Norman, Okla. (March 8) ... Went 3-for-4 with a walk and two runs scored in game two versus UMKC (March 11) ... Had an RBI double and drew a walk the next day against Arkansas (March 12) ... Drew two walks in the first game of the doubleheaders versus Drake (March 16) and at Bradley (March 21) ... Went 3-for-4 in game one of twinbill with SEMO (March 31) ... Had a season-high four runs batted in, scored twice, hit a home run and stole a base in game two of doubleheader sweep of Evansville (April 4) ... Drew two walks in game two versus Loyola (April 11) and again at Illinois State (April 18) ... Went 1-for-1 with two walks at Tulsa (April 29).

2014 (Freshman)

Played in 39 games as a freshman, starting in 32 ... Tied for fifth on the team with 12 walks drawn ... Her first career hit was a double against Central Michigan (Feb. 14) ... belted her first career home run against Lipscomb (Feb. 23) at the Blues City Classic, a game in which she scored twice ... Drove in a run in three-straight

games from February 23 through March 7 ... Went 2-for-4 with a double, run scored and an RBI against Bradley (March 20) ... Drew at least one walk in four-straight games from April 12 to April 16, including a season-high two bases on balls in the series finale versus Indiana State (April 13) ... Background

Was a three-year standout for head coach Randall King at Broken Arrow (Okla.) High ... As a senior, she led the Lady Tigers in hitting (.450) and went 20-3 in the circle for a Broken Arrow squad that won district and regional titles ... Her team finished third at state and she was named district pitcher of the year ... Earned all-state first team and all-region honors along with academic all-conference accolades and was named Tulsa World Athlete of the Week on October 17, 2012 ... Her junior season, Gambill was an all-district first teamer and all-metro honorable mention selection ... Hit .430 with 15 doubles and 34 runs scored while leading her team to a regional title in 2011 ... As a sophomore, her team won regionals and she earned all-conference honorable mention accolades ... Was selected as an academic allconference honoree in each of her final three seasons at Broken Arrow High ... Helped her Diamond Girls club squad to a first-place finish in the Colorado Fireworks in 2011.



Made a successful transition to the outfield as a junior and led the team with a .373 batting average -- the fourth-highest average in the MVC -- and earned All-MVC first team honors ... Started 35 games and played in 39 total ... Went 3-for-4 with a double and run scored in a win at Western Kentucky (Feb. 19), the beginning of a four-game hit streak in which she picked up eight hits ... Stole first base of the year and scored in a 2-for-4 game at WKU (Feb. 20) ... Dropped a successful sacrifice bunt and scored a run in back-to-back games versus UMKC (March 4) and SEMO (March 5) ... Began a five-game hitting streak with a single in the

game against SEMO (March 5) ... Picked up a hit in three-straight appearances from March 12 through Apr. 3 ... Went 3-for-5 with an RBI in the series opener against Southern Illinois and then contributed three more hits in the series (Apr. 9-10) ... Kicked off a six-game hitting streak with three hits in the doubleheader versus Wichita State (Apr. 20) ... Added five hits, including a double, and scored three times in the series at Northern Iowa (Apr. 23-24) ... Had a 2-for-3 game with a run scored, a stolen base and a sac bunt in series opener at Evansville ... Ended the season on a six-game hitting streak ... Picked up a pair of hits and scored a run in win versus Indiana State that clinched a spot in the MVC Tournament (May 7) ... Went 2-for-4 with a stolen base in the MVC Tournament quarterfinals against SIU (May 13).

2015 (Sophomore)

Roark played in 51 games and started 32 at second base ... Hit .222 with 17 runs scored. four stolen bases and three RBI ... Was the eighth toughest to strikeout among Valley hitters ... Went 2-for-3 with a run scored and a stolen base versus Arkansas-Pine Bluff (Feb. 7) ... Collected two hits, drove in a run and scored another at Louisiana Tech (Feb. 8) ... Stole a base in back-to-back games at Indiana State to close out the series (March 28-29) ... Recorded a hit in each game of doubleheader against SEMO (March 31) ... Went 2-for-3 with an RBI and stolen base in game two versus Evansville (April 4) ... Drove in a run in series finale with Evansville (April 5) ... Extended season-long hitting streak to four games with singles and a run scored in each end of twin bill versus Loyola (April 11) ... Drew a walk and scored three runs in game one at Illinois State (April 18) ... Had a hit in back-to-back games at home against Wichita State (April 22) and Missouri (April 23) ... Crossed the plate twice in the series opener versus UNI (April 25) ... Hit safely in the final two games of the regular season at SIU

(May 2-3) ... Went 1-for-1 with a run scored and a successful sacrifice in MVC Tournament semifinal win over Illinois State (May 8).

2014 (Freshman)


Holly Hesse

Head Coach • 29th Season Alma Mater: Creighton (1982)

Head coach Holly Hesse enters her 29th season leading the Bears' program as the second-winningest coach in Missouri Valley Conference history with 726 victories. Hesse joined the 700-victory club with a 4-0 win at Illinois State on April 18, 2015, completing a doubleheader sweep in Normal, Ill.

She is the winningest softball coach in Missouri State history with a 726-721-2 record. Her tenure includes two regular-season MVC titles, five MVC tournament crowns and five NCAA Tournament appearances. Hesse recorded her 300th win in 2000, her 400th win in 2004, her 500th in 2007 and victory number 600 in 2012. Missouri State leads all schools with 70 wins in the MVC Tournament and Hesse has the second-most MVC Tournament wins with 49.

Hesse's 2016 squad finished ranked 13th in the country with a .973 fielding percentage. The Bears went 22-30 and earned a spot in the MVC Tournament in a do-or-die series to end the regular season. Her team rallied to the



challenge and carried the momentum to the MVC Tournament quarterfinals.

The 2015 Missouri State team catapulted into the upper echelon of the Valley by finishing second in the regular season and reaching the MVC Tournament title game. Behind Hesse's tutelage, the Bears set team records for home runs (48), bases on balls drawn (181), double plays turned (22), sacrifice flies (14) and saves (10). Senior Rebecca McPherson clubbed a program-high 12 home runs, while junior Erin Duewel set the all-time single season slugging percentage mark at .667 for Hesse's squad that won 17 MVC games, one shy of the school record.

Hesse and her long-time associate head coaches Sue Frederick and Beth Perine won their 500th game as a staff on March 13, 2014, a 4-3 win in the Bears' home opener against SIU Edwardsville.

In 2011, Hesse's Bears overcame an upand-down regular season to play their best softball when it mattered most. Her Bears, led by Tournament MVP Natalie Rose, won fourstraight games to earn the sixth Tournament title in team history. Rose hurled four complete games over three days including shutouts of Bradley and UNI on the opening day. Her team then went 1-2 in the Norman Region of the NCAA Tournament, knocking off Iona in an elimination game.

At the 2010 Valley Tournament, the Bears once again turned to their ace in the circle to surprise the field with wins over two of the league's top four teams, as sophomore righty Natalie Rose pitched six straight complete games to lead MSU to three wins in all before regular-season champ Southern Illinois ended the Bears' quest for a sixth NCAA bid with a 4-3 decision in the semifinal round.

At the 2008 State Farm MVC Tournament, the Bears rode the right arm of senior All-MVC performer Melissa Porche to wins over Evansville, Southern Illinois and Illinois State, moving MSU to within one game of an NCAA Tournament berth.

Missouri State's 40-17 record in 2006 included a second-place MVC regular season finish at 18-4, marking the 12th season during

Hesse's guidance the Bears have finished in the top five of the conference standings. At the MVC Tournament in Omaha, Neb., Missouri State knocked off the regular-season champs, Illinois State, in the semifinals and defeated Wichita State for the title. The Bears' march to the championship included three wins by the score of 4-0, and marked the fourth MSU conference tournament title under Hesse's guidance. Missouri State advanced to the Los Angeles Regional, as the Bears made their fourth trip to the NCAA Tournament under Hesse.

The 2006 team's 40 wins surpassed the school's previous top win total of 38 set by Hesse's 1994 squad. The 2006 season marked the sixth 30-win season under Hesse, who has guided the Bears to an average of 26 wins per season since her arrival in 1989.

Hesse's most successful stretch at Missouri State came from 1994-98, when her teams averaged 32 wins per season, won an MVC regular-season championship and three tournament championships. The Bears advanced to the NCAA Tournament in three consecutive seasons from 1996-98.

In 1998, Missouri State became the first team in league history to three-peat, winning its third straight Valley crown and again punching a ticket

to the NCAA Tournament. The Bears played in the NCAA Regional at Stillwater, Okla., and ended the season with a 31-22 record.

The 1997 season saw the Bears finish 35-26 and become just the second team in Gateway/ MVC history to win back-to-back tourney titles. Missouri State claimed the league crown in Cedar Falls, lowa, and represented the Valley in the NCAA Regional at Norman, Okla.

The thrilling, come-from-behind Missouri State win over Southern Illinois in the 1997 MVC winners' bracket final was Hesse's 228th career victory, making her the school's winningest softball coach.

In 1996, Hesse led Missouri State to its first MVC title and its first NCAA berth since 1983 as the Bears rang up a 34-22 record, won four straight games to collect the conference crown in Normal, Ill., before competing in the NCAA Regional at Fullerton, Calif.

Hesse won Gateway Conference Coach of the Year honors in 1992, after guiding Missouri State to a 14-4 mark and the regular-season title. In 1994, she led MSU to the Missouri Valley crown with a 13-3 record and was again voted coach of the year. The 1994 Missouri State club set a school record with 38 wins, won the MVC regular-season title by three games and took second in the league tournament, which MSU hosted.

Off the field, Hesse has been active in promoting both the sport of softball and women's sports in general. Nationally, she is one of the founding faculty members of the NCAA Women Coaches Academy, which was created to enhance the skills and perspectives of women coaches, and to aid in the retention of women coaches in intercollegiate athletics. Hesse served also on the Board of Directors for the Alliance of Women Coaches from 2012-16. She currently is on the Board of Directors for True North Sports, which provides innovative educational programs for coaches and athletes..

Locally, she is the former president of the Springfield chapter of the Women's Intersport Network (WIN), having served in that role from 2009-2012.

In 2003, Hesse authored a coaching book, which is now available online, entitled "The Diamond of Success: A Philosophical Model for Coaching." In 2016, the Missouri State University Board of Governors honored coach Hesse with the Staff Excellence in Public Affairs Award in recognition of her distinctive work and accomplishments in support of Missouri State's public affairs mission.

A 1982 graduate of Creighton University, Hesse came to Missouri State after two years as an assistant coach at her alma mater. Creighton compiled a record of 72-31, won a High Country

Before her two years in Omaha, Hesse served as an assistant coach for two seasons each at Iowa State University and the University of Massachusetts in Amherst, where she earned her master's degree in sport management in 1984. Hesse also coached for two seasons at Waukon (Iowa) High, her prep alma mater.

Hesse was a standout pitcher at Creighton, where she became the school's first 20-game winner and helped the Jays to three consecutive Women's College World Series appearances.

A native of Waukon, Iowa, Hesse won an incredible 161 games as a pitcher for Waukon High. She was inducted into the Iowa Girls High School Pitchers' Hall of Fame in 1979.













Sue Frederick enters her 27th year on the Missouri State softball coaching staff. In her role as associate head coach, Frederick works with the Bear infielders, offense and oversees MSU's strength and conditioning, team travel, practice organization, budgeting and clinic development.

Frederick came to Missouri State straight from a successful playing career at Creighton. Since joining the Missouri State staff, Frederick has seen the Bears compile a 700-661-2 record and win six conference championships during her time in Springfield. She helped lead the Bears to three straight Missouri Valley Conference Tournament championships from 1996 to 1998 and helped guide them to five NCAA Tournament appearances.

Frederick earned the status of One-Star Master Coach in 2001 after completing courses through the National Fastpitch Coaches College.

A native of Ankeny, Iowa, Frederick played for the Virginia Roadsters in the inaugural Women's Professional Fastpitch season in the summer of 1997.

Frederick, who graduated cum laude from Creighton in 1989, was a four-year standout and



career .302 hitter on the Jays' softball team and set school career records for hits (209) and stolen bases (47). As a sophomore, she set CU single-season marks with 69 hits and 41 runs scored and then tied her hit record with 69 in her senior campaign.

Over a three-year stretch, Frederick had 31 straight successful stolen base attempts, a feat which puts her 23rd on the all-time Division I list and her .423 batting mark as a sophomore in 1987 ranked 10th in the nation that year and second in CU history.

A two-time all-region first teamer, Frederick helped the Jays to High Country Conference titles in 1986 and 1987, with a College World Series berth in 1986. She was a first team all-conference

Former Creighton standout Kelsey Allender joins the Missouri State coaching staff this season as first-year graduate assistant.

She played 188 games for the Blue Jays from 20013-16 and made 185 consecutive starts to begin her collegiate playing career -- including 180 in a row in center field.

As a senior in 2016, she led the Big East in sacrifice bunts (15) and ranked fourth nationally in that category. She also drove in 15 runs in her final season and scored 20 runs.

She was the Blue Jays' leader in at-bats (142) and plate appearances (161) her junior season while ranking second in hits (40), primarily batting leadoff. She belted a home run against Arizona State and drove in two runs in a 3-for-4 day against the Sun Devils On Feb. 5, 2015.

Allender earned Big East All-Academic Team honors after her sophomore season in 2014 and started all 53 games, laying down seven sacrifices. She was named to the Big East Honor Roll on March 10 after hitting .500 at the Rebel Spring Games, March 11-15, 2014.

Her freshman season, she started every game with 42 starts in center and five in left. She also drove in 20 runs, stole four bases and hit an inside-the-park home run against Grambling on Feb. 24, 2013.

She accounted for 131 career hits, 49 RBI and 34 sacrifices in her days in Omaha to go with nine outfield assists and 169 putouts.

Originally from Manvel, Texas, she was a four-time all-district pick at Manvel High and became the first player in her program's history to reach that milestone. She set career and single-season records at Manvel for hits, runs and stolen bases, batting .451 with 40 stolen bases her junior season. She was also a Texas 4A all-state pick her last two seasons and earned District 24 Player of the Year honors her final two seasons.

She ranked in the top 10 of her high school class and was active in student council and volunteered with Special Olympics and other community events.





A product of Lubbock Christian University, experienced instructor and coach Kristen Doty joins the Missouri State staff this season as a volunteer assistant coach.

She served as a coaching intern at Lubbock Christian for coach Daren Hays while at the Division II institution. While there, she assisted the coaching staff in all aspects of the practices and was responsible for working with the Lady Chaps outfielders. She was also a collegiate golfer, playing a year at Lubbock Christian and two years at Central Baptist.

The NFCA certified coach has coached a number of age-group teams, including a 16U travel squad in Lubbock, Texas that advanced to USSSA nationals, and an 8U team in Izard County, Ark.

Doty is also a personal softball instructor, providing private lessons for ages 6-18, and working with players on hitting, bunting and fielding fundamentals as well as advanced techniques.

The native of Horseshoe Bend, Ark., was a standout prep player at Izard County High School where she earned all-district, all-conference all-region and all-state honors for coach Matt Orf. She had the highest batting average on her prep club all four years and led her team to four district and conference titles. She also claimed all-state tournament laurels and competed for the elite Gold level of travel ball, earning MVP honors at a number of tournaments. She decided not to pursue a collegiate softball career after suffering an elbow injury in high school.

Ninth Year at Missouri State

Cliffon M. "Cliff" Smart III begins his sixth year as the leader of Missouri State University in 2016. He was named interim president on June 27, 2011, and served in that role until he was named the 11th president of Missouri State University on Oct. 16, 2012, after a nationwide search. He served as the University's general counsel from December 2007 until being named interim president.

Under Smart's leadership, Missouri State has made significant progress in a number of areas, including setting enrollment records for the Springfield campus and Missouri State System; adding additional academic programs, including the Doctor of Nursing Practice, the Doctor of Nurse Anesthesia, Master of Occupational Therapy, Master of Fine Arts, and Bachelor of General Studies; increased the number of online course offerings and the number of remote sites; expanded and improved partnerships with two-year institutions as well as four-year universities; completed the Our Promise campaign which raised \$167 million, \$42 million more than the original goal of \$125 million; and completed or renovated a number of facilities, including: Foster Family Recreation Center, new campus entrance, McQueary Family Health Sciences Hall, Plaster Center for Free Enterprise and Business Development with The eFactory, Jim D. Morris Basketball Complex, the Davis-Harrington Welcome Center, the O'Reilly Clinical Health Sciences Center, and a series of recreation and athletic facilities (Plaster Stadium; Betty and Bobby Allison Recreation Fields; Allison North and South Stadiums).

Smart joined The Strong Law Firm in 1992. He was a shareholder in the firm from 1995-2007 and vice president since 1998. In his 15 years with the firm, his practice consisted primarily of representing individuals and entities in catastrophic injury, medical malpractice and commercial cases.

Smart currently serves on the NCAA Division I Board of Directors and was recently elected president of the Council on Public Higher Education in Missouri.

Smart and his wife, Gail, have two sons: Murray, who along with his wife, Amy, both graduated in 2012 from Southwest Baptist University and live in Rogers, Ark., with their daughters, Addy and Emery, and son, Parker; and Jim, a recent graduate of Knox College in Illinois.

Director of Athletics
Eighth Year at Missouri State

Missouri State University's search for its new director of athletics concluded May 28, 2009, with the introduction of **Kyle Moats** as the University's 10th A.D. Moats came to the University after serving as associate athletics director for national marketing at the University of Louisville since 2005.

During Moats' tenure at MSU, he has hired seven head coaches, while leading the charge for facility upgrades totaling nearly \$22 million, including the Dr. Mary Jo Wynn Academic Achievement Center project, the Jim D. Morris Basketball Complex and new or renovated home facilities for 12 of MSU's 17 sports. In 2013-14, he helped spearhead the passage of the Bear Experience and Recreation (B.E.A.R.) Fee, which will generate \$1.4 million annually toward the enhancement of four separate athletics facilities upgrades, including the construction of a new east side complex for student seating at Plaster Stadium, a new sand volleyball facility, as well as the Betty & Bobby Allison North (field hockey) and South (soccer, track and field) Stadiums.

In addition to being able to implement several facets of Missouri State's long-range athletics facility improvement plan through the B.E.A.R. Fee, Moats' played a pivotal role on the task force that paved the way for the reinstatement of women's tennis as a varsity sport in September 2013. As a result of the task force's careful evaluation and recommendation, President Clif Smart announced the return of women's tennis for the 2014-15 academic year, making it the 11th women's sport and the 17th varsity program to operate under the MSU Athletics umbrella. Missouri State's decision to revive the program after an eight-year hiatus will ensure the University's long-term compliance with Federal Title IX regulations. Additionally, Moats played an integral role in MSU's negotiations for a new multi-year television contract with Nexstar Broadcasting, Inc.

In a busy first year on the job, Moats wasted little time in laying groundwork for the future of Missouri State Athletics. From day one he emphasized the importance of fostering a strategic vision in the current landscape of intercollegiate athletics by involving all corners of the campus community in developing a long-range plan for the MSU Athletics. Moats played a key role in Missouri State's partnership with Nelligan Sports Marketing (now Learfield Sports), announced in February 2010.

Year two for Moats in Springfield saw Missouri State finish second in the 2010-11 MVC All-Sports Trophy standings — its best finish in five years. Conference titles by men's basketball, women's swimming and softball, as well as postseason tournament berths for both MSU basketball programs highlighted the Bears' year.

In 2011-12, Moats' third year at the helm, Missouri State enjoyed its finest campaign in nearly a decade, capturing the Missouri Valley Conference All-Sports Trophy for just the fourth time. The Bears won Valley titles in women's swimming and diving, women's indoor track and field, women's basketball and women's golf that year along with a co-championship in men's soccer. Additionally, four MSU teams advanced to postseason play, including NCAA Tournament appearances for the Bears' volleyball, women's golf and baseball programs.

Moats' efforts helped make the Jim D. Morris Basketball Complex a reality during the 2012-13 academic year. The \$3.7 million construction project, completed in December 2013, features state-of-the art locker rooms, training facilities, offices

and meeting space in JQH Arena. Additionally, all MSU athletic programs have met the NCAA's APR requirements in each of the last three years, while a record 177 student-athletes posted grade-point averages of 3.25 or better in 2013-14.

Prior to his arrival in Springfield, Moats spent four years as associate athletics director for national marketing at Louisville. In that capacity, he coordinated the Cardinals' efforts in national awareness, marketing, branding and group ticket sales. He also worked closely with Nelligan, which manages the exclusive marketing rights for Cardinal Athletics. Moats oversaw the Louisville band and spirit squads as the liaison with student government and student spirit groups.

Prior to joining the Louisville staff, Moats served as senior associate athletic director for two years at Marquette University, where he oversaw the Golden Eagles' Blue and Gold Fund, media relations, ticket operations, special events, licensing, radio, television, marketing and promotions and sponsorships with NSM. He also worked 14 years in the University of Kentucky athletics department, including his last three there as associate athletics director for marketing (2000-02).

A native of Dixon, Ill., Moats is a 1988 graduate of Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville with a bachelor's degree in physical education. Moats was a three-year letterwinner in golf and a student assistant basketball coach for the Cougars from 1985-88. He earned a master's degree in sports management from the University of Kentucky in 2001.

Moats and his wife, Leeann, have a son, Kirk, and a daughter, Lauren.

Casey Hunt enters her ninth full year as associate director of athletics and her 14th year overall at Missouri State.

Hunt oversees the operations of several of the institution's 17 men's and women's sports programs. In addition, she has oversight of the Bears' athletic training and strength and

conditioning programs and serves as the primary personnel administrator for intercollegiate athletics and sport administrator for MSU's baseball, women's basketball, track and field, cross country, men's soccer, field hockey and volleyball programs.

A four-year starter in women's basketball at St. Bonaventure, Hunt was inducted into the school's athletics hall of fame in 2007. Additionally, she was inducted into the Luzerne County (Pa.) Sports Hall of Fame in August 2010.



KILLIAN STADIUM

With the completion of a \$2.7-million renovation project at Killian Sports Complex, the dream of a new state-ofthe-art home facility became a reality for the Missouri State softball program in the spring of 2009.

Operated by the Springfield-Greene County Park Board, Killian Softball Stadium features seating for up to 1,200 spectators, making the East Springfield venue an attractive and viable candidate to host NCAA regional competition. The Bears' new home is certifiable under the Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design program due to its use of sustainable and environmentally friendly building materials and equipment.

Designed by Springfield firm Pellham-Phillips Architects & Engineers, the Killian Stadium project is part of a department-wide effort to upgrade the city's recreational facilities. The redesigned Killian complex features surface improvements, upgraded lighting, coaches offices, a training room and locker facilities. The new and improved facility serves not only the Bears, but also houses the Park Board's softball leagues and plays host to numerous national tournaments in the Queen City.







▲ Under the guidance of head coach Melissa Stokes, the Missouri State volleyball team has continued a tradition of excellence that has made the Bears one of the winningest programs in all of Division I. The Bears have appeared in nine of the last 14 NCAA Tournaments, claiming MVC Tournament titles in 2005 and 2008 (above) and winning the league's regular-season title this past fall.

▶ Jackie Stiles set the NCAA record for career points (3,393) as well as the single-season scoring (1,062) record as a senior at Missouri State. Stiles garnered the Honda Awards Program Broderick Cup and was the Wade Trophy recipient as the nation's top women's college basketball player in 2001, when she led MSU to its second Final Four in nine years.



▲ The 2010-11 Missouri State Bears captured the men's basketball program's first Missouri Valley Conference regular-season title, finishing with a 15-3 league mark and a 26-9 overall record after advancing to the second round of the National Invitation Tournament. The previous season, the Bears swept the CollegiateInsider.com Tournament field for the eighth national tournament title in MSU history.





▲ The Missouri State Lady Bears have been one of the nation's most-successful women's basketball programs over the last quarter of a century, racking up 21 Missouri Valley Conference titles, fifteen 20+ win seasons, and 14 NCAA Tournament berths, including three Sweet 16 appearances and trips to the Final Four in 1992 (above) and 2001.





FACILITIES



JQH Arena has been the home of the Missouri State Bears basketball teams since its official opening in November 2008. The world-class arena seats more than 11,000 and has a state-of-the-art video scoreboard. Hotel developer John Q. Hammons made JQH Arena possible with a donation of \$30 million.



John Q. Hammons Student Center is the home of the MSU volleyball and swimming teams, which has a main arena capacity of 4,646 permanent reserved seats.



Jim D. Morris Basketball Complex opened in December 2013 thanks to a major gift from Springfield philanthropist Jim D. Morris. The complex, located on the south side of JQH Arena, features locker rooms, coaches' offices, an athletic training facility and state-of-the-art team video and meeting rooms.



Plaster Strength Center is one of the largest of its kind in the Missouri Valley Conference. Strength coach Jeremiah Frey and his staff supervise the recently-renovated free-weight based facility.



Robert W. Plaster Stadium is the home of Missouri State football. The 17,500-seat facility includes a 4,000-seat precast concrete east grandstand and a new FieldTurf playing surface thanks to the passage of MSU's B.E.A.R. Fee, which will provide \$1.4 million annually toward four separate athletics facility upgrades in the coming years. A game day meeting room for the Bears and a visitor's locker room are also features of the new Plaster Stadium.



Bears Golf Facilities

include many of the area's premier courses, including a team complex and indoor facility at Twin Oaks Country Club. MSU also utilizes exclusive facilities at Hickory Hills Country Club, Highland Springs Country Club, Millwood Golf and Racquet Club, Rivercut Golf Course, and Branson Creek Golf Club.





Hammons Field is located just blocks from the Missouri State campus. The 8,000 seat, natural grass stadium includes 28 luxury suites, five party decks, six food and beverage outlets, a souvenir shop and a club lounge. The Bears, who hosted the 2015 NCAA Springfield Regional at Hammons and, will welcome the MVC Championship to Springfield for the third time in May.



Killian Softball Stadium opened in March 2009 as the home to the Missouri State softball team. Operated by the Springfield-Greene County Park Board, the East Springfield venue offers seating for up to 1,200 spectators and served as host for the 2011 MVC Softball Championship.



Cooper Tennis Complex will serve as the home to Missouri State women's tennis. The facility, operated by the Springfield-Greene County Park Board, features 12 indoor courts, 16 lighted outdoor courts and an outdoor Mediacom Stadium court that seats 2,500. It also includes meeting and locker rooms, a concession stand, pro shop and fitness facility.



Betty & Bobby Allison North Stadium serves as the new home of Missouri State field hockey after opening in the fall of 2014. Located at the corner of Holland Avenue and Harrison Street on the former site of the Missouri State Softball Field, the facility features a seating capacity of 250.



Betty & Bobby Allison South Stadium opened in the fall of 2014 as the new home of Missouri State track and field and men's and women's soccer. Made possible by the passage of MSU's B.E.A.R. Fee, the facility features a synthetic track and permanent concrete grandstand with seating for up to 1,000. MSU hosted the 2016 MVC Men's Soccer Championship at Allison South this past November.



SPORTS MEDICINE

Athletic Medical and Rehabilitation Services

The Missouri State Athletic Medical and Rehabilitation Services staff has more than 100 years combined experience in athletic training. Included are director Jim Penkalski; assistant director Shannon Derricks; and athletic trainers Suzie Atkinson, Tyler Landgraf and Steve Sawchak, as well as rehabilitation specialist and performance enhancement coordinator Mitch Hauschildt. All are certified by the National Athletic Trainers' Association and licensed by the Missouri State Board of Healing Arts. Five intern athletic trainers join the full-time staff, along with a host of athletic training students who work with student-athletes under the supervision of staff members.

Another essential asset to MSU studentathletes is the involvement of physicians and medical personnel from the community and Missouri State's **Taylor Health and Wellness Center**. Head team physician Landon Hough, as well as team physicians Shawn Freeman, Royce Moore, Richard Seagrave, Victor Wilson, Rodney Witt and dietician Natalie Allen, attend to the medical needs of over 400 Missouri State student-athletes.









Strength and Conditioning

Physical development of more than 400 student-athletes to increase athletic performance, decrease the chance or severity of injury and enhance sport-specific athletics development are the goals of Missouri State Strength and Conditioning.

Director of strength and conditioning
Jeremiah Frey supervises the 7,200-squarefoot **Plaster Strength Center** that is utilized
by all 17 sports. Frey oversees a full-time
staff of two assistant strength coaches who
help guide the student-athletes through
programs designed to improve individual
skills and overall team performance.
The programs integrate all phases of
development, including free weights, multijoint exercises, plyometrics, conditioning,
flexibility, speed and nutrition.

The strength and conditioning staff works with coaches and **Athletic Medical** and **Rehabilitation Services** to develop programs suited for each sport and its student-athletes. Areas of concern in each participant are identified and a strength program is put in place to address all items with the ultimate goal of improving competitive performance.

Located adjacent to the Turner Family
Practice Court inside Hammons Student
Center, the Jim D. Morris Family Strength
and Conditioning Center is the primary
strength and conditioning facility of both
Missouri State basketball programs.

UNIVERSITY

issouri State University is a public, comprehensive metropolitan system with a statewide mission in public affairs, whose purpose is to develop educated persons. The University's identity is distinguished by its public affairs mission, which entails a campus-wide commitment to foster expertise and responsibility in ethical leadership, cultural competence and community engagement.

The academic experience is grounded in a general education curriculum which draws heavily from the liberal arts and sciences. This foundation provides the basis for mastery of disciplinary and professional studies. It also provides essential forums in which students develop the capacity to make well-informed, independent critical judgments about the cultures, values and institutions in society.

The Missouri State University campuses are structured to address the special needs of the urban and rural populations they serve. Missouri State University-Springfield is a selective admissions, graduate level teaching and research institution. Missouri State University-West Plains is a separately accredited open admissions campus primarily serving seven counties in south central Missouri. Missouri State University-Mountain Grove serves Missouri's fruit industry through operation of the State Fruit Experiment Station. Missouri State Outreach provides anytime, anyplace learning opportunities through telecourses, Internetbased instruction, iTunes U and through its interactive video network.









Campus Overview

MSU's Springfield campus includes 38 educational and general buildings and 20 auxiliary enterprise facilities.

Libraries

The Missouri State University Library System is composed of four libraries: the Duane G. Meyer Library, the Music Library and the Greenwood Laboratory School Library (all in Springfield), and the Paul G. Evens Library of Fruit Science (Mountain Grove). The Meyer Library offers more than two million books and printed materials. The library contains more than 944,000 state and federal government documents and is the only United Nations document depository in the state.

Downtown Presence

The Springfield campus has several buildings located in the city's historic downtown. They include the Kenneth E. Meyer Alumni Center, the Park Central Office Building, the Jim D. Morris Center for Continuing Education and the Great Southern Building. The University also leases the Levy/Wolf Building on Park Central Square for office space and outreach programs.

IDEA Commons

The Innovation, Design, Entrepreneurship and Art Commons is a geographic area in downtown Springfield that includes several Missouri State facilities: Brick City (an Art and Design department building) and the Roy Blunt Jordan Valley Innovation Center (a scientific research center). The IDEA Commons is an urban research park that will also include privately owned residential, retail and entertainment facilities. It creates an environment that generates creativity, innovation and entrepreneurship for the benefit of the Springfield region.

Did you know...

- Missouri State University is one of the 13 four-year, public supported institutions of higher education in Missouri.
- Located in the state's third largest city, Missouri State is within a 500-mile radius of nearly 50 percent of the U.S. population.
- In addition to the main campus in Springfield, the Missouri State system is comprised of a two-year branch campus in West Plains, a research campus in Mountain Grove and an extended campus that coordinates telecommunication-based delivery of distance education among and by the three campuses.
- Over 85 percent of the freshmen entering in Fall 2016 were in the top half of their high school classes; the group of first-time MSU students brought an average high school GPA of 3.64 and a composite ACT score of 24.0 to campus.







STUDENT LIFE

Missouri State Campus

The Missouri State campus is located on 225 acres in the heart of Springfield. The campus is compact — students easily walk from one class to the next in just a few minutes. MSU students experience college life at its best, with more than 300 student organizations from which to choose.

Where students are from... In Fall 2016, a record 24,116 students enrolled on MSU's Springfield campus and a total of 26,000 enrolled in classes in the Missouri State University system. Overall, 112 of Missouri's 114 counties were represented on campus, and students from 47 states, as well as 89 foreign countries, were enrolled at MSU.

Residence Halls

More than 4,000 students live in 10 University residence halls and apartment complexes. Missouri State's nationally recognized residence halls are among the finest in the country.



Taylor Health and Wellness Center

Located on campus adjacent to Plaster Student Union, Taylor Health and Wellness Center consists of a full-time professional staff of board-certified physicians, RNs, LPNs, registered pharmacists and lab and X-ray technicians. All students are eligible for care at the Center, which is in the process of a multi-million dollar upgrade.



Juanita K. Hammons Hall

This 2,200-seat, multipurpose performance facility brings to campus touring Broadway musical productions, entertainment performances and an emerging concert artist's recital series. It is the home of the Springfield Symphony Orchestra.



Missouri State Bookstore

Serving Missouri State University since 1905, the Missouri State Bookstore provides a full line of textbooks, official apparel, academic supplies, convenience items, study aids and a complete line of computer hardware and software, available at academic prices.



Robert W. Plaster Student Union

The PSU is the hub of the campus community. It has a post office, bank, convenience store, movie theater, bowling alley, study areas and many dining options. PSU is home to many student groups and University organizations.



Foster Recreation Center

The Foster Recreation Center is one of the newest additions to the Missouri State campus, opening in 2012. The state-of-the-art, LEED-certified facility offers students, faculty and staff great resources for living healthy lives, including a recreational pool, spa and sauna, indoor jogging track, basketball courts, fitness center with cardiovascular equipment and free weights, rock-climbing and bouldering walls and a free-standing boulder outside for climbing.





ACADEMICS

he University offers more than 185 undergraduate programs and nearly 50 graduate programs, as well as select certificate and doctorate degrees. Many of these programs are the state's strongest and largest of their kind.

Public Affairs Mission

Missouri State is proud of its mission in public affairs. The components of the public affairs mission are ethical leadership, cultural competence and community engagement.

Through this mission, students develop understanding of issues that affect the local community, the world at large and the environment. The courses they take challenge them to become informed and active citizens. On top of that, opportunities for volunteering and service-learning put students in real-world situations.

Missouri State holds a Public Affairs Week and Public Affairs Conference each year to further express the components of the mission. Speakers address topics such as citizenship, democracy, diversity, the economy and sustainability.

The Wichita, Kan., native picked up second-team Academic All-America recognition in 2010, before being selected by the Dallas Cowboys in the fourth round (110th overall) of the 2011 NFL Draft.

Missouri State has a total of 797 full-time faculty members on the Springfield campus. The student-to-faculty ratio is approximately 19:1, with nearly 90 percent of full-time faculty members having the most-advanced degree available in their field.

2016 Season Highlights

- Junior Olivia Roark was named to the All-MVC first team after she hit .404 in conference games this season, the fourth-best batting average among league players.
- Missouri State's defense ranked 13th in the country with a .973 fielding percentage. The Bears ranked among the nation's top 15 in defense for 14 straight weeks to end the season.
- Sophomore Erika Velasquez Zimmer was named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District VI First Team on May 5.
- Junior pitcher Erin Struemph fired a completegame, two-hit shutout versus Indiana State on May 7. It was her eighth complete game of the MVC season and she allowed five or fewer hits in seven of those complete games.
- Sophomore Erika Velasquez Zimmer (April 12) and Struemph (April 19) picked up MVC Scholar-Athlete of the Week in consecutive weeks for the Bears. Struemph also earned MVC Pitcher of the Week honors on April 18, the first MSU hurler to earn both awards in the same week since Melissa Porche won both the week of March 24, 2008.
- With her three strikeouts at UNI on April 23, Struemph passed Kellie Becher for fifth in school history. She completed her MSU career with 474 career strikeouts.
- Struemph struck out a career-high 13 Ramblers in game one at Loyola on April 3. It was the most strikeouts in a game by an MSU pitcher since 2011 and tied for most in MVC for the season.
- Senior Erin Duewel slugged her eighth home run of the season on April 16 at Drake. It was her 21st career long ball, giving her sole possession of second place in MSU history. Fifteen of her career home runs came against MVC teams.
- Six of sophomore Kaitlin Beason's eight home runs came in the same game in which she was the pitcher of record.
- Redshirt sophomore Allie Alvstad missed the entire 2014-15 academic year to battle through acute myeloid leukemia. She received a bone marrow transplant in December 2014 and returned to the team in 2015-16. In her first plate appearance of the 2016 season, Alvstad drew a four-pitch walk against Northern Colorado on Feb. 13. On Feb. 19, she drove in her first run of the season with a pinch-hit ground out at Western Kentucky. Alvstad registered her first hit since returning with a single to right field on March 11 versus Omaha in Lawrence, Kan.
- Struemph earned the second-straight MVC Scholar-Athlete of the Week nod for an MSU softball player when she picked up the award on April 19. She held a measly 0.39 ERA over three outings during the week of April 11-17, including a complete game three-hit shutout to deal Drake its first MVC loss of the season.

- Sophomore Kaitlin Beason put both aspects of her game together at the Cancer Awareness Tournament in St. Louis. On March 4, she earned the win in relief against UMKC. She also hit a three-run home run in the game against the Kangaroos. She returned the next day and pitched 5.0 innings to earn the victory over SEMO. In the win over the Redhawks, Beason belted two home runs, her second career multihomer game. One of her blasts was her first career grand slam, helping her own cause in the circle. Beason continued the trend with a home run against UNI on March 12. She pitched 6.0 innings in the start against the Panthers, striking out a career-high four batters.
- Missouri State received more first-place votes than any other Valley squad, but finished second in a top-heavy Missouri Valley Conference preseason coaches poll released by the league office on January 27. The Bears also were well represented on the preseason All-MVC team with senior Erin Duewel, junior Erin Struemph and sophomore Erika Velasquez Zimmer earning nods. All three players were All-MVC

first team members in 2015.

- The Bears have drew 109 bases on balls and were hit by a pitch 26 times. MSU received a free pass to first base by one or both of these means in 48 of the 52 games. In the Feb. 13 game versus Northern Colorado, MSU drew 12 walks, one shy of the single-game program record set in 2004.
- Beason had a breakout weekend in Texas to open the season, notching three career-bests on the weekend. In the season opener versus Texas Southern (Feb. 12), she drove in four runs for the first time in an MSU uniform. That same day, she took to the circle and pitched all nine innings against Detroit, three innings longer than her previous long outing. Then on Feb. 14, Beason drew three walks against Northern Colorado, her first career multi-walk game.
- Senior Braxton Coil completed here career with 427 putouts and 28 assists in 115 appearances, mostly behind the plate, including 83 starts. She also tallied three doubles and two home runs.



The Missouri Valley Conference, the nation's second-oldest NCAA Division I conference, continues to be a leader in college athletics and is one of the nation's most progressive conferences, celebrating its 110th season in 2016-17. League members have worked together to focus on common goals and objectives, placing a high value on league harmony, while continuing to invest in athletic programs to compete at the highest level.

The Valley brand remains very strong, both regionally and nationally, and the great athletic tradition of The Valley remains a compelling force in recruiting student-athletes and in marketing all the MVC programs.

Men's basketball continues to be the engine that drives Valley athletic programs. In 2016, UNI and Wichita State represented the Conference in the NCAA Tournament, and the teams combined for three victories. Recent success in resurrecting the challenge series with the Mountain West Conference, and the increased opportunities for MVC teams to participate in ESPN's early-season multi-team events and in other elite tournaments, have added strong opponents and more national television exposure to the non-conference scheduling mix.

The State Farm MVC Men's Basketball Championship – affectionately known as Arch Madness - continues to be a spectacular showcase for the league, and the MVC has extended the tournament agreement with the Scottrade Center that will keep Arch Madness in St. Louis through at least 2018. During the 2011 MVC Championship,

the league surpassed 1 million in total attendance for the event, now in its 27th year in the Gateway City. The tournament, in 2016, celebrated its 40th anniversary overall.

While the success of men's basketball has received the greatest attention, the overall performance of league teams in virtually every sport continues to raise the national profile of the Conference.

In women's basketball in 2016, four Valley teams reached post-season play. MVC Tournament champ Missouri State represented the league in the NCAA Tournament, and the Lady Bears were joined by Drake (WNIT), UNI (WNIT) and Southern Illinois (WBI) in post-season play. The Panthers reached the third round of the WNIT. Meanwhile, the Conference remains committed to keeping the tournament at a neutral site. The women's tournament, tagged "Hoops in the Heartland," will compete in the iWireless Center in Moline, Ill., for the second time in 2017 as part of a multi-year agreement to conduct the league's post-season tournament at a neutral site in the Quad Cities.

In baseball, regular-season and MVC Tournament Champion Dallas Baptist represented the league in the NCAA Tournament and was one win away from reaching the Super Regional, falling to No. 5 overall seed Texas Tech in the regional finals. Four league teams won 30+ games led by the Patriots' league-best 44 victories. A total of 17 players were taken in the 2016 Major League Baseball draft.

For the third time in league history, four Valley volleyball teams were selected as part of the field of 64 to play for the 2015 NCAA national title. MVC regular-season and tournament champion Wichita State was joined by at-large selections Missouri State, UNI and Southern Illinois in the 2015 NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball Championship. Four conference teams were also a part of the 2010 and 2007 NCAA Volleyball Championship fields.

In track & field, league student-athletes continue to be dominant nationally in the sport, as the MVC has now produced 18 national champions in the sport in the past 10 years. Notably, 20 student-athletes from MVC schools qualified for the 2016 NCAA Outdoor Championship in Eugene, Ore., and all 20 earned All-America recognition. The Valley placed five athletes on the First Team, four on the Second Team and eleven as Honorable Mention. The list was highlighted by DeAnna Price of Southern Illinois who claimed first-place in the Women's Hammer Throw for the second-consecutive year.

Meanwhile, the success of The Valley television package is one of the great stories in the league. The MVC Television Network has blossomed into a revenue-generating vehicle and The Valley's most visible marketing tool. Also, The Valley continues to be proactive in upgrading the production and marketing of both institutionally-produced and Conference-produced events.

The summer of 2015 yielded two major announces on the TV front, as ESPN and the Missouri Valley Conference announced a 10-year extension to their current media rights agreement that will provide increased coverage of Conference events across ESPN platforms through 2023-24.

As part of the deal – which continues a business relationship that began in 1986 – ESPN, the Missouri Valley Conference and its 10 member institutions will work jointly to develop in-house production capabilities at each campus that will provide significant national coverage for multiple sports on ESPN3 and hands-on educational opportunities for students. As a result, ESPN3 will showcase a minimum of 820 events a year (a minimum of 70 men's basketball) in the final six years of the agreement on the league's co-branded network (The Valley on ESPN3).

Additionally, CBS Sports and the MVC are in the midst of a multi-year agreement to televise Valley basketball games on the CBS Television Network and CBS Sports Network. The deal, which begins this season and continues through 2019-20, is through a sublicense agreement with ESPN. CBS Sports has televised the men's basketball tournament final since 2006.

In 2010, The Valley took a major step toward ensuring current revenues in television media and tournament sponsorship sales would be guaranteed in future years when it announced a 10-year partnership with Learfield Sports. The Jefferson City, Missouri-based company has the exclusive sales and marketing rights to MVC assets that include championships and television advertising. In June 2016, the MVC and Learfield Sports extended that partnership through 2023-24, concurrent with the league's contract with ESPN.

Notably, the 2016 men's basketball tournament marked the return as State Farm Insurance as the event's title sponsor. The Valley remains the only college athletics conference that State Farm sponsors, and State Farm has been a sponsor of the conference since 1984, first as an advertiser on league TV games. State Farm last had naming rights of the men's basketball championship in 2012.

During the tenure of Doug Elgin, The Valley's ninth and longest-tenured commissioner, The Valley has been aggressive in hosting NCAA events in St. Louis. From 1998-2010, the MVC served as host for a staggering nine NCAA tournament events in that 13-year period, which has made St. Louis one of the most frequent stops on the NCAA Tournament trail. The Valley hosted Women's Final Fours in 2001 and 2009 and the Men's Final Four in 2005. In 2016, The Valley hosted a first- and second-round men's basketball event in Scottrade Center. The Valley also hosted an NCAA secondand third-round men's basketball event at Scottrade Center in St. Louis in 2014, and in 2013, the league hosted an NCAA second- and third-round men's basketball event in Kansas City. The Valley previously assisted with preliminary round men's events in both 2008 and 2012 in Omaha.

The seeds for the creation of the Conference were planted by eight administrators representing five institutions, who met at the Midland Hotel in Kansas City, Mo., on Jan. 12, 1907. The five schools which formed the Missouri Valley Intercollegiate Athletic Association were Washington University of St. Louis, and the state universities of Iowa, Kansas, Missouri and Nebraska. Two months after the initial meeting, two more schools -- Drake University and Iowa State College -- were admitted





In the fall of 1907, basketball became the first competitive sport. Today, the Missouri Valley Conference sponsors the following sports: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country and track & field (indoor and outdoor), men's and women's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, women's swimming and diving, men's and women's tennis, and women's volleyball.

While The Valley no longer sponsors football (it did from 1907-85), six league members compete in football at the FCS (Football Championship Subdivision) level as Illinois State, Indiana State, Missouri State, UNI and Southern Illinois play in the 10-member Missouri Valley Football Conference (with North Dakota State, South Dakota, South Dakota State, Western Illinois and Youngstown State). That league competed as the Gateway Conference from 1985-2007. Drake plays non-scholarship football in the Pioneer Football League.

This season, the league will conduct its 106th outdoor track and field championship, its 99th tennis championship, its 63rd baseball tournament, and its 79th golf championship for the men. Those programs, plus other current sponsored sports of cross country (58 years), indoor track (66), men's soccer (26), women's soccer (20), and swimming and diving (23), have helped solidify The Valley as one of the nation's most respected conferences.

Athletic accomplishments include four NCAA national basketball championships, 17 trips to the NCAA Final Four, a 1989 national baseball championship and 19 College World Series qualifiers. The league owns a total of 32 post-season national team championships, including two men's

basketball crowns in 2015 (Evansville-CIT; Loyola-CBI). In 2001, Missouri State added to The Valley women's accomplishments, as the Lady Bears advanced to the Women's Basketball Final Four in St. Louis. Creighton (2004) and Missouri State (2005) have claimed national championships (WNIT) in women's basketball. MSU also has a 1992 NCAA Women's Final Four appearance, and Creighton (2003), Drake (1999) and Illinois State (2009) have made semifinal trips to the WNIT postseason tournament.

Indeed, the inclusion of women's programs under The Valley banner has provided a boost. The Gateway Collegiate Athletic Conference -- which began in 1982 -- merged with The Missouri Valley Conference and was unveiled as part of the new conference on July 1, 1992.

While the inclusion of women's sports under a comprehensive athletic umbrella is a recent development in the league's storied history, over the years, Valley student-athletes and coaches have become household names during the league's illustrious history, both during their collegiate careers and, for some, professional careers.

In fact, The Valley began honoring that tradition in the summer of 1997, when the Conference began its athletics Hall of Fame. Hersey Hawkins of Bradley, Larry Bird of Indiana State, Wes Unseld of Louisville, Coach Henry Iba of Oklahoma State, Dave Stallworth of Wichita State, Ed Macauley of Saint Louis, and Oscar Robertson of Cincinnati were members of the initial induction class. Currently, more than 90 former players, coaches and alums dot the league's Hall of Fame.

Men's basketball, perhaps, has the league's most storied tradition, boasting the likes of Hall of Famers Bird and Robertson as former players, which includes a list of more than 260 drafted to the NBA, but The Valley has also produced national-caliber student-athletes in its other sponsored sports. In 2001, Missouri State's Jackie Stiles became the first Valley woman to earn the Honda-Broderick Cup, given to the nation's top female collegiate student-athlete. In June of 2016, Stiles was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame.

In the sport of track and field, Indiana State's

Holli Hyche captured seven national sprint titles in the early 1990s, Southern Illinois' Darrin Plab won back-to-back NCAA outdoor high jump titles in 1991 and 1992, SIU's Brittany Riley became the World record holder in the weight throw in 2007, and Kylie Hutson of Indiana State swept both the indoor and outdoor pole vault titles in 2009 and in 2010. Southern Illinois' Jeneva McCall (three NCAA individual championships), Illinois State's Tim Glover (back-to-back javelin championships in 2011 and 2012), Indiana State's Felisha Johnson (indoor weight throw in 2011 and 2013), and Southern Illinois' DeAnna Price (hammer throw in 2015 and 2016) are the most recent multi-year NCAA champions in the league's highly decorated history in track & field. Meanwhile, Raven Saunders of Southern Illinois earned NCAA shot put titles in both the 2015 indoor and outdoor meets.

League members include Bradley, Drake, Evansville, Illinois State, Indiana State, Loyola Chicago, Missouri State, Northern Iowa, Southern Illinois and Wichita State.

Central Arkansas and Southern Illinois Edwardsville are affiliate members in men's soccer; Dallas Baptist is an affiliate member for baseball; Arkansas-Little Rock is an affiliate member in women's swimming and diving; and Stony Brook competes as an affiliate member in men's and women's tennis.

All-American Barb Gaines

Infielder Barb Gaines (right) became the first Missouri State softball All-America pick as a senior in 1993. She was named to the National Fastpitch Coaches Association All-America Third Team after authoring one of the most outstanding careers in the

A native of St. Louis, Gaines enjoyed a brilliant senior season, ranking among the national top-10 in batting average for most of the season and finishing with a then-school record .442 mark. Gaines ranked first in the Missouri Valley Conference in hits (68) and second in stolen bases (22).

The first player in Gateway/MVC history to win all-league honors four straight years, Gaines closed her career with five Missouri State single-season records and eight career marks. She still holds the career records for hits (252), total chances (1,287), and batting average (.403), is second in stolen bases (58), and at bats (626), third in putouts (1,013) and fourth in runs (113).

Gaines received the Missouri State Outstanding Female Athlete award in 1992 and 1993 and was inducted into the Missouri State Athletics Hall of Fame in 2000. On April 20, 2013, she became the first player to have her jersey retired by the Missouri State softball program.

Tournament Field

The field for the 2017 NCAA Softball Tournament will consist of 64 teams and will be announced on May 14.

For the 11th consecutive year, softball will use the same format as Division I baseball, sending four teams each to 16 regional sites with the winners advancing to Super Regionals. The Super Regional winners will move on



to the Women's College World Series, held June 1-7, in Oklahoma City. In all, 32 conferences will receive automatic bids and 32 teams will receive at-large bids.

Sixteen regional championships each consisting of four teams will be contested Friday through Sunday, May 19-21. Each double-elimination regional will be hosted by one of the schools competing in that regional

The 16 regional winners will advance to the Super Regionals played Thursday through Sunday, May 25-28, again hosted by one of the two institutions involved at each site.

The eight Super Regional winners will advance to the Women's College World Series in Oklahoma City.

2017 Women's College World Series

The 36th annual NCAA Division I softball finals will be played Thursday, June 1, through Wednesday, June 7, at ASA Hall of Fame Stadium in Oklahoma City, Okla., with the University of Oklahoma and the Oklahoma City All Sports Association serving as hosts

The WCWS will consist of two four-team brackets with a double-elimination format. The winner of each four-team bracket will advance to the championship, which will be played as a best-of-three series. For more information, visit NCAA.com/Championships/softball/d1.

Missouri State in the NCAA Tournament

The Bears have competed in six NCAA Division I Tournaments, in 1983, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2006 and 2011. In 1983, Missouri State went 1-2 in dropping a best-of-three series at Missouri. In 1996, the Bears were 0-2 in regional play at Fullerton, Calif., and again went 0-2 at the 1997 Norman, Okla., Regional. In the 1998 NCAA Regional in Stillwater, Okla., Missouri State pulled off the biggest upset of the 32-team tournament as the Bears, seeded fourth in the regional, stunned ninth-ranked Stanford, the regional's top seed, 5-2 in the first round. It was a milestone win for MSU, which had gone two-and-out in the NCAA the two previous years. It marked the Bears' first NCAA win under Hesse and the first by the program since 1983. Missouri State was the only #4 seed to defeat a No. 1 seed in the opening round of the tournament that season.

National Invitational Softball Championship

This season marks the return of the National Invitational Softball Championship (NISC). Following selections by the NCAA Tournament field on May 14 the NISC will select the next-best 48 teams to its championship field. Eight regional sites, each hosting six teams, will conduct double-elimination tournaments, May 16-18. The championship round, consisting of the eight regional winners, will take place May 21-24 in a double-elimination format.

There will be 32 automatic qualifiers, consisting of the next team from each conference not selected through NCAA criteria, and 16 at-large qualifiers, based on RPI; win-loss record of .500 or better; record vs. top 50 RPI. For more information, visit WomensNISC.com.
