

THE TEN COUNT

- Jarrid Rhodes (Sr., Palmetto, Fla.) has posted 10 points or more in 7 of the last 8 games and 10 of the last 12. He has scored 20 or more points three times in the last five games -- the only three 20-point games of his career. He knocked down his 100th career 3-pointer in the win over Valparaiso, making him just the 16th Bear to do so.
- MSU is coming off 18 offensive rebounds vs. Valpo, the club's second-highest total of the season (20 vs. Southern U.)
- The Bears' 83 points vs. Valpo on Thursday night marked the second-highest point total by the club ever at Arch Madness (84 vs. Creighton, 3/6/04 quarterfinals). Earlier this year, MSU scored 88 vs. Hampton (12/8/17).
- · Alize Johnson (Sr., Williamsport, Pa.) broke his own MSU Arch Madness record with 19 caroms on Thursday vs. Valpo. He is 7 rebounds away from tying William Doolittle (1973-74) for No. 3 spot on MSU's season rebound list (380).
- Two of MSU's seven losses this season by four points or less have come against the Salukis.
- Alize Johnson is 24 points shy of becoming the school's 29th 1,000-point scorer (fifth two-year player). His 724 career rebounds also puts him No. 6 on the program's career list and the most by any two-year performer.
- The 42 combined points by Alize Johnson and Jarrid Rhodes against Valpo on Thursday were the second-most ever by MSU teammates at Arch Madness, just behind 43 by David Brewer (23) & Arnold Bernard (20) vs. Tulsa (3/3/91)
- Missouri State's 38.9 rebounds per game this season is the club's second-best of its Division I era (since 1982-83). The 1995-96 Bears grabbed 39.0 caroms per game, which was the club's top average since 1979-80 (43.8).
- Bears' head coach Paul Lusk scored 1,610 points as a player at Southern Illinois from 1992-95 and played in three NCAA Tournaments for the Salukis. He also served as an assistant coach at SIU for the 2003-04 season. Other former Saluki players who have recently served at Missouri State include assistant coaches Brad Korn (1999-2004), Derrick Tilmon (1997-2000), Kent Williams (1999-2003) and Kyle Smithpeters (2004-06). Current SIU head coach Barry Hinson was 169-117 (.591) in 9 seasons (1999-2008) as head coach of the Bears.
- Missouri State is 16-9 all-time in MVC Tournament quarterfinal games (2-3 under Lusk).
- With Thursday's win over Valparaiso, MSU head coach Paul Lusk picked up his 106th win with the Bears, tying him with Arthur Briggs (1913-1923) for the No. 6 spot on the program's coaching wins list.
- This season, the Bears are 4-1 on Fridays.

Head Coach Paul Lusk

Paul Lusk (Southern Illinois, 1995) is 106-120 (.469) in his seventh season at MSU and 108-143 (.430) in his eighth season overall as a head coach. He is 52-74 in MVC games (35-28 at home, 17-46 on the road), 5-6 in MVC Tournament games and 49-40 against all non-conference foes (32-13 at JQH Arena. 12-15 away and 5-12 at neutral sites). In all games, he is 67-41 at home, 29-61 on the road, and 10-18 at neutral sites. Lusk is 7-9 all-time against Southern Illinois. He is 5-6 in the MVC Tourney (1-1 vs. SIU).

The 46-year-old Lusk took the reins as MSU's 17th head coach on April 1, 2011. He came to Springfield after seven seasons at Purdue (2004-11), including his last three as associate head coach. Now in his 17th season in the coaching profession, Lusk has previous stops as an assistant at Southwestern Illinois (1996-97), Missouri Southern (1999-2002) and Southern Illinois (2003-04) in addition to a one-year head coaching stint at (Div. III) Dubuque (2002-03). He has played or coached in 10 NCAA Tournaments.

Lusk finished third in the MVC Coach of the Year voting in 2014 and was a finalist for the Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award that same year. He was also named one of the Top 25 high-major assistants by FoxSports.com in 2010, and CollegeSportsMadness.com named him MVC coach of the year in 2012. He is a member of the Illinois Basketball Hall of Fame after scoring 2,743 points during a highly-touted prep career at Wesclin High in New Baden, III. He went on to play 107 college games at Iowa and Southern Illinois, earning All-MVC second-team honors in 1994 for the Salukis.

Zay Named to All-MVC First Team for Second Straight Season

Alize Johnson (Sr., Williamsport, Pa.) was announced as an All-MVC first-team honoree on Feb. 27, marking the second straight season he has earned the league's elite honor. He is averaging 15.3 points and a league-best 11.7 rebounds per game through the Bears' first 32 games. He was named MVC Player of the Week three times this season. With 976 points, he ranks 29th on MSU's career scoring list, while his 724 rebounds rank No. 6 all-time for the Bears, despite playing just two seasons. He joins Kyle Weems (2011-12), Johnny Murdock (1993-94) and Blake Ahearn (2006-07) as the only Bears to earn back-to-back All-MVC first-team honors.

Church Gets Defensive

Junior Obediah Church (Springfield, III.) became just the second Bear to earn MVC All-Defensive Team honors twice when he joined Merrill Andrews (2003-04) with that distinction on Feb. 27. The high-flying junior leads the Missouri Valley Conference with 1.9 blocked shots per game, which ranks 42nd nationally. His 184 career blocks is the most-ever by a Missouri State player. He enters postseason play with 101 career dunks and is averaging 6.7 points and 5.6 rebounds per game this season. He has also converted a team-best 65.6 percent of his field goal attempts during the 2017-18 campaign.

Bears on the Air

All Missouri State games will air live on the Missouri State Radio Network with Springfield flagship station KTXR (101.3 FM) providing the feed to the eight-station network and at RadioSpringfield.com.

The voice of the Bears, Art Hains, first began calling MSU's action in 1977 and is in his second stint and 37th season overall. He called MSU games from 1977-81 and returned to the mic in 1985. Hains celebrated his 1,000th MSU basketball broadcast (and 2,000th MSU event) on Jan. 2, 2013 against Illinois State at JQH Arena. Former MSU great Mike Keltner (1970-74) provides color commentary.

Johnson Named Valley Player of Week on Feb. 12

Alize Johnson (Sr., Williamsport, Pa.) was named MVC Player of the Week on Feb. 12, his third such honor this season. He helped the Bears to a 2-0 week after averaging 19.5 points, 10.5 rebounds, 6.0 assists and 2.0 blocks per game. He tallied 28 points behind five 3-pointers in the Bears' 19-point win at Indiana State on Feb. 5 and followed that performance with 11 points, 13 rebounds and seven assists in MSU's 17-point home win over Evansville on Feb. 10. It was the fifth such honor of Johnson's career after winning the award twice last season. The only Bear to win the award more times is Kyle Weems (2008-12) who earned it six times in his career.

Free The Freshman

In his first career start on Feb. 3, freshman Mustafa Lawrence (Newark, N.J.) scored 19 points in a 33-minute assignment at Loyola, going 7-of-14 from the field and 5-of-9 from 3-point range. He scored 12 points off the bench against Illinois State on Jan. 30 -- nearly doubling his season scoring output to that point -- to earn the start at Loyola. He has scored in double figures 5 times over the last 10 games.

Church Becomes Career Blocked Shots Leader

On Jan. 27, junior Obediah Church (Springfield, III.) blocked 2 shots against Southern Illinois to become Missouri State's all-time leader in shot rejections, surpassing Danny Moore (167 from 1996-99) for the top spot. For the second year in a row. Church leads the MVC -- with 1.9 blocks per game -- and now has 184 career rejections. His 60 blocks this season rank 45th nationally

Scurry, Fofana to Miss Time after Therapy Mishap

An adverse reaction to a cryotherapy treatment on Jan. 22 sidelined MVC All-Bench Team selection Reggie Scurry (Jr, Atlanata, Ga.) and Abdul Fofana (So., Bobo Dioulasso, Burkina Faso) who both developed severe foot blisters after a whole-body cryotherapy session. The Bears are 2-8 since then.

All of MSU's players went through the cryotherapy treatment, but no other team members were affected. Cryotherapy is the use of low temperatures in recovery to relieve muscle pain, sprains and swelling.

Johnson Earns Fourth Career POW Distinction

Alize Johnson (Sr., Williamsport, Pa.) was named MVC Player of the Week for the second time this season on Jan. 15. He averaged 18.5 points and 15.0 rebounds in two games while firing at a .481 (13of-27) clip from the field against Evansville and Indiana State.

Alize On Three Award Watch Lists

Alize Johnson was announced Oct. 19 as one of the 20 candidates for the 2018 Karl Malone Power Forward of the Year Award. The five finalists will be announced in March.

Johnson was also on the Citizen Naismith Trophy Award Watch List (but did not make the final 25 cut) and the Lou Henson Mid-Major Player of the Year Award Watch List (now on the top 40 list of award semifinalists). Likewise, on Jan. 10, Sports Illustrated listed Johnson atop the list of "Five Mid-Major Prospects That Should Be on NBA Radars."

Miller Earns MVC Newcomer of the Week Laurels on Jan. 8

J.T. Miller (Sr., Clinton, N.C.), a transfer from Howard University, averaged 14.5 points and 8.5 rebounds in two games the week of Jan. 1 to earn MVC Newcomer of the Week Honors for the first time. He also fired at a 57.9 clip from the field. In his 99th career game, he logged his first-ever double-double, racking up 16 points and a career-best 11 boards at Illinois State with 2 blocks and 2 steals. Earlier in the week, he scored 13 points off the bench against UNI, snagging 6 rebounds with a blocked shot.

Two Double-Doubles Impress at The Nest

Missouri State boasted two individual double-doubles in the Bears' loss at Illinois State on Jan. 7. Alize Johnson (Williamsport, Pa.) scored 16 points and snagged a game-high 12 rebounds as part of his 11th double-double on the season. Meanwhile teammate J.T. Miller (Clinton, N.C.) also scored 16 points and recorded a career-high 11 rebounds to notch his first career double-double (in his 99th career game). The last time MSU had two players post a double-double in the same game was Feb. 13, 2016 when Camyn Boone (30 pts./12 reb.) and Chris Kendrix (19 pts./12 reb.) paired up vs. Indiana St.

String of Double-Doubles Highlights Run

Alize Johnson reeled off eight straight double-doubles from Dec. 19 to Jan. 17, the longest stretch of Missouri State's Division I era and fourth-longest in the Missouri Valley Conference in the last 20 years. Johnson's 37 career double-doubles ranks 2nd in MVC over the last 20 years, behind Egidijus only Mockevicius (Evansville) 57.

First 3-0 League Start Since 2010-11

With Missouri State's 62-55 win over Northern Iowa at JQH Arena on Jan. 4, the Bears started Missouri Valley Conference play 3-0 for the first time since the 2010-11 season.

Under then-coach Cuonzo Martin, the 2010-11 club started 7-0 en route to a 15-3 conference ledger and MVC regular-season championship.

Johnson Hits 20-20 for Second Time

Senior Alize Johnson (Williamsport, Pa.) posted his second 20-20 game of the season -- and third of his career -- in MSU's 62-55 win over Northern Iowa on Jan. 4. Johnson posted 23 points and 20 rebounds in the home victory. Johnson also recorded 23 points and 20 rebounds against North Dakota State on Nov. 17. As of March 1, he is one of just 10 Division I players this year to post a 20-20 game and only one to do it twice.

Johnson Named Valley Player of the Week on Dec. 26

Alize Johnson (Williamsport, Pa.) was named MVC Player of the Week on Dec. 26 -- the third of his career -- after posting a pair of double-doubles in wins over Wright State and Loyola. He averaged 18.0 points and 12.5 rebounds for the week, including 24 points against Loyola in the MVC opener.

Lusk Hits a Hundred

MSU head coach Paul Lusk recorded his 100th victory as Bears' head coach on Dec. 31 with the club's win at Valparaiso. Lusk is just the seventh head coach at Missouri State to reach the century mark in victories. He is also the 6th active coach in The Valley to reach 100 wins at his current institution.

Lusk picked up his 100th career victory -- including his one season at Dubuque -- on Dec. 19, 2017 with a 66-50 win over Wright State at JQH Arena.

Three More Bears Reach 500

Two Bears, Ryan Kreklow (Jr., Columbia, Mo.) and Obediah Church (Jr., Springfield, Ill.), both eclipsed 500 career points in MSU's win over Loyola on Dec. 22. Kreklow (in his 74th game) and Church (in his 77th) join teammates J.T. Miller -- currently MSU's only active 1,000-point scorer -- along with Alize Johnson and Jarred Dixon who had already surpassed 500 career points.

A sixth member of the 2017-18 squad, Jarrid Rhodes (Sr., Palmetto, Fla.) eclipsed 500 points on Feb. 14 -- his 61st career game -- after a career-high 21-point outing at Southern Illinois.

Three-Point Record Falls

The Bears' .684 3-point percentage (13-of-19) against Hampton on Dec. 8 set a new JQH Arena record. It was also the best 3-point percentage by the Bears in a game in which MSU made 10 or more threes. The overall MSU 3-point percentage record is .889 (8-of-9) vs. Tulsa on Dec. 2, 1989.

Miller Scores 1,000

Fifth-year transfer **J.T. Miller** (Sr., Clinton, N.C.) eclipsed 1,000 career points On Nov. 24 against Evangel when he knocked down an early layup at the 17:50 mark of the first half in his 90th career game. He posted 930 points in 83 games at Howard before coming to MSU for his final year of eligibility.

Johnson Second to 20-20 (Take 1)

With his 23 points and 20 rebounds against North Dakota State on Nov. 17, **Alize Johnson** became just the second DI player this season to post a 20-20 game. It was his second career 20-20 game.

Excellent in Estero

Missouri State shot 46.0 percent from the field and 77.8 percent at the foul line to go 2-1 at the Gulf Coast Showcase, Nov. 20-22, in Estero, Fla. The Bears won the consolation championship with a 71-60 win over FAU after dropping a narrow 74-73 decision to Georgia Southern in the first round and then downing Manhattan, 69-65, in the next. MSU had a +9.7 rebound margin with **Alize Johnson** averaging 16.0 points and 9.0 boards, and classmate **J.T. Miller** averaging 13.0 points.

Bears Begin Collecting Road Kill

MSU has eight wins away from JQH Arena this season, including road wins over Top 50 RPI teams Western Kentucky (83-56 on Nov. 1) and South Dakota State (73-53 on Dec. 2) as well as a road wins over NDSU (71-58 on Dec. 4), Valpo (67-50 on Dec. 31) and Indiana State (81-62 on Feb. 6). MSU also has three neutral victories over Manhattan (Nov. 21), FAU (Nov. 22) and Valparaiso (March 1).

Dixon, Kreklow Cap Notable Free Throw Streaks

Junior guards **Jarred Dixon** (Kansas City, Mo.) and **Ryan Kreklow** (Columbia, Mo.) each had extensive free throw streaks headed into the 2017-18 campaign. Kreklow made **24** straight foul shots from Jan. 24 to Nov. 28, 2017. Dixon entered the season with **23** straight makes, but missed his first attempt of this season to cap the streak from Feb. 9 to Nov. 15, 2017.

Charitable Beginnings

Missouri State's exhibition game at Kansas State on Oct. 21 was added via special permission from the NCAA to benefit the American Red Cross' hurricane relief efforts. The game at Bramlage Coliseum in Manhattan attracted more than 2,500 fans and raised more than \$15,000 to help victims of natural disasters in Texas, Florida and Puerto Rico.

Big Bea

Tanveer Bhullar (Sr., Etobicoke, Canada), a fifth-year transfer from New Mexico State, is the tallest player ever to play basketball at Missouri State. At 7-foot-2, the veteran is at least three inches taller than every other MSU player this season. he is the brother of 7-5 Sim Bhullar, who became the first player of Indian descent to play in the NBA when he made his pro debut with the Sacramento Kings (2013-14).

Every Day is Game Day for Kreklow Family

To say that Bears' junior **Ryan Kreklow** (G, Columbia, Mo.) comes from an athletic family would be an understatement. His parents Wayne (head coach) and Susan (asst. coach) are volleyball coaches at Missouri where they have each had stints as head coach and co-head coaches over the last 19 seasons together. Wayne was named 2016 SEC Coach of the Year.

Ryan's older sister, Ali, just finished her senior season for the volleyball Tigers at Mizzou, while his older brother, Ricky, played college basketball at Missouri, California and Creighton.

Before his volleyball coaching days, Wayne Kreklow was an All-American basketball player at Drake and was later a member of the NBA World Championship Boston Celtics in 1980-81. His mom was also a college volleyball player at Missouri State before her highly-touted coaching career.

Returning Award Winners

In addition to first-team selection **Alize Johnson**, two other Bears earned MVC accolades last year. **Obediah Church** (Springfield, III.) was on the MVC All-Defensive Team after he blocked a league-high 74 shots last season (2.39 per game) which ranked 21st nationally. He also pulled down 5.8 rebounds per game and accumulated 16 steals. He and Dixon were also MVC All-Freshman Team picks in 2016.

Jarred Dixon (Kansas City, Mo.) earned MVC All-Bench Team laurels after he averaged 8.6 points per game as a sophomore with 23 appearances in reserve. He finished the season with a 2.0 assist-per game average and snagged 26 steals.

Success on Signing Day

On Nov. 8, MSU received a National Letter of Intent on Nov. 8 from *Kabir Mohammed (F, 6-5, 225, Jr., Lagos, Nigeria, Fort Washington (Md.) NCA, San Jacinto College)* for 2018-19:

Mohammed averaged 10.8 points and 8.3 rebounds as a freshman for coach Scott Gernander at San Jacinto College in Pasadena, Texas last season. He was an All-Region honorable mention pick as part of a 33-2 club that claimed the Region 14 title in 2016-17 and advanced to the NJCAA national tournament. He was also on the San Jacinto Dean's List as well as earning NABC Academic Excellence national honors. As a high school senior at National Christian Academy in Fort Washington, Md., Mohammed logged 18.1 points and 12.3 rebounds per game for an Eagles team that won the Beltway League title and finished 27-2 overall and 10-0 in the region. He was an all-conference pick for coach Trevor Brown in 2016 and eclipsed 1,000 career points. He posted a 25-point, 28-rebound game against Bull City Prep (11/28/15) as one of two 20-20 games his senior year before earning his school's valedictorian laurels.

Exit Polls

For the first time since joining the Missouri Valley Conference in 1990-91, the Bears are the league's preseason favorite to win the regular-season title, according to a preseason poll of Valley coaches, media and communications professionals. MSU received 30 of the possible 40 first-place votes -- and 381 points in all -- followed by UNI (337), Loyola (321), Illinois State (256) and Southern Illinois (226) to round out the 10-team league's upper division.

MSU was picked second in 2010-11, the only time the Bears have won the MVC regular-season crown.

Sitting This One Out

Four Missouri State players are sitting out the 2017-18 for various reasons. Newcomers **Darian Scott** (Fr., Las Vegas, Nev.) and **James Byrd II** (Jr., Kansas City, Mo.) are redshirting this season, while transfer **Jarred Ridder** (Fr., Springfield, Mo.) is sitting out this campaign as his year in residence, per NCAA transfer rules. Finally, **Greg Williams** (So., Houston, Texas) has not played or dressed out this season due to numerous medical procedures he has undergone in the past two years.

Bears Basketball History

The Bears have an all-time record of **1656-976** (.629) in their 106th season and are **672-459** (.594) in their 36th season since making the move to Division I in 1982-83.

Now in their 10th season at JQH Arena, the Bears are 111-52 (.681) all-time at the 11,000-seat facility. During the Division I era, MSU has made NCAA Tournament appearances in 1987, 1988, 1989, 1990, 1992, and 1999. With NCAA Tournament wins over Wisconsin and Tennessee, the 1999 Bears advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 for the first time in program history. The Bears have appeared in the National Invitation Tournament nine times -- 1986, 1991, 1993, 1997, 2000, 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2011. The 1986, 1993 and 2006 squads all reached the NIT quarterfinals. In 2010, MSU earned the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament championship and in 2014 made their second CIT appearance in five years.

The Bears hold the distinction of having four of the 25 best RPI ratings ever to be left out on NCAA Tournament as at-large selections. The 2005-06 squad had the 21st-best RPI on Selection Sunday, while the 2006-07 team was No. 36 the following year, both of which resulted in Tournament snubs. MSU's 1999-2000 squad was ranked No. 34 a year after its Sweet 16 run and was left out of the big dance.

MSU won NAIA national championship titles in 1952 and 1953 under the late coach Bob Vanatta, while making six NAIA national tournament trips from 1939-1954. MSU also appeared in the NCAA Division II Tournament 10 times, finishing as national runners-up four times -- 1959, 1967, 1969 and 1974.

MSU has won 24 regular-season conference titles, including the 2010-11 MVC championship. The Bears have also recorded 28 seasons of 20 or more victories, including 15 in the Division I era.

Preseason Player of the Year

Missouri State senior forward **Alize Johnson** (Williamsport, Pa.) was named Missouri Valley Conference preseason player of the year during the league's media day event in St. Louis on October 24.

Johnson is just the second MSU player -- and first since Kyle Weems in 2011-12 -- to be named as the Valley's top player in the preseason.

Last season, Johnson averaged 14.8 points and a league-best 10.6 rebounds per game to earn All-MVC first-team honors and MVC Newcomer of the Year distinction. The transfer from Frank Phillips (Texas) College tabulated 17 double-doubles as a junior, which ranked 15th among all DI players.

Missouri State University

Hammons (businessman, hotel developer), Bob Holden (43rd governor of Missouri), Bill Mueller (2003 American League batting champ), and Jackie Stiles (Hall of Famer and former Division I women's basketball all-time career scoring leader).

Newcomer J.T. Miller led five Missouri State players in double-figures to help the Bears to an 85-80 opening-night victory at Western Kentucky.

Miller went 7-for-12 from the field with three dunks and 8 rebounds.

Alize Johnson played just 14 minutes but accounted for 13 points and 8 rebounds, including four key free throws in the final 32.1 seconds for the Bears.

After MSU (1-0) built a 22-point lead out of the gates, WKU whittled its way back with ample free throw opportunities and made a game of it late.

With the Bears up 66-57 after a layup by Miller at the 8:30 mark, WKU went on a 7-0 run in the span of 100 seconds to make it a two-point game. But a gutsy layup by Reggie Scurry followed on MSU's next possession to give coach Paul Lusk's club some breathing room.

Inside three minutes to go, WKU got a free throw from Darius Thompson to pull within 72-70, but a triple by Ronnie Rousseau III silenced the crowd of more than 5,200 at E.A. Diddle Arena with 2:07 on the clock.

Rousseau scored again on MSU's next possession and made it 77-72, but the home club did not stop coming with a dunk by Dwight Coleby and a trey by Thompson, the latter of which made it 81-77 with 24.1 to go.

After Johnson missed the second of a two-shot foul chance at the 21.1 mark, Lamonte Bearden drained his third 3-pointer of the night to make it 82-80 with 15 ticks to play.

The Bears dug deep and responded with back-to-back defensive stops, sandwiched in between free throws by Ryan Kreklow and Johnson to seal the win.

Scurry and Rousseau each scored 12 for the Bears, and Obediah Church added 11 points.

MSU shot 55.7 percent from the field and out-rebounded the Hilltoppers, 38-34. Western Kentucky finished 28-of-36 (.778) at the foul line and had 12 fewer field goals than the visitors. Bearden led WKU with 24 points.

Missouri State jumped out of the gates like a Kentucky thoroughbred, building a 26-4 advantage in the first eight minutes and forcing two Hilltopper timeouts.

The game shifted slightly after that with WKU picking up 14 of its next 18 points at the free throw line over the next eight-plus minutes. A charity shot by Thompson with 3:43 to go in the opening stanza made it a 38-22 contest.

After a dunk by Scurry built MSU's lead back to 16 with just under three minutes to play in the half, freshman Mustafa Lawrence nailed a triple from the left side to give the Bears a 43-26 advantage at the 1:55 mark.

With MSU being whistled for 18 fouls in the first 20 minutes, the Bears' went deep down the bench for the stretch, and WKU took advantage with a pair of 3-pointers and another couple of free throws to make it 45-34 at the midway point.

Alize Johnson posted a double-double, and J.T. Miller notched a team-high 16 points to lead Missouri State past visiting Southern University, 86-58, in the Bears' 2017-18 home opener.

Johnson finished with 10 points, 14 rebounds and 5 assists in a 22-minute assignment, while Miller was 5-for-5 from the field, including a pair of 3-pointers.

MSU, which out-rebounded the Jaguars by a 51-41 margin, also got 13 points from Jarrid Rhodes and 11 from Ryan Kreklow in the victory.

Missouri State never trailed in the contest and pulled ahead by as many as 31 points in the second half.

Southern was led by Brendon Ganaway with 11 points, and Eddie Reese with 10. Reese knocked down three 3-pointers on the night, while teammate Emanuel Sheperd tallied 9 rebounds to lead the visitors.

The Bears burst out to a 9-0 lead in the first three minutes before the Jags even got on the board. MSU stretched its lead to double figures on a dunk by Miller at 13:36 that made it 15-5 at the time.

The Bears used a 9-0 run later in the opening half, including five points by Miller to push ahead 37-19 and then doubled up the Jaguars, 42-21 on a fast-break layup by Ronnie Rousseau III.

Missouri State ended the half on another run that included a triple by Miller, who had 13 points in the first stanza, and a layup by Rhodes. The Bears shot 52.9 percent from the field in the first 20 minutes and had 14 assists on 18 field goals.

The second half was much the same early. A triple by Rousseau on the first bucket of the period doubled up the score again, 52-26 before Kreklow hit two of his three trevs on the night over the next two minutes.

Kreklow gave MSU its first 30-point lead of the night, 62-32 on a jumper with 15:17 to go.

The visitors took advantage of MSU's reserves midway through the second half with Sheperd converting a pair of layups and the Jags collecting 3-pointers by Reese and Richard Lee to get within 69-47 at the 9:15 mark.

But Missouri State reeled off the game's next eight points with scores by Jarred Dixon, Reggie Scurry, Obediah Church and Johnson over the next five minutes to put the game on ice.

Alize Johnson posted game highs with 23 points and 20 rebounds, but it wasn't quite enough as the Bears dropped a 57-54 decision to visiting North Dakota State. NDSU was led by A.J. Jacobson with 14 points, including 3 first-half 3-pointers.

After trailing by as many as 10 in the first half, MSU took charge out of the gates in the second stanza and led by as many as five. With less than four minutes to go in the game, the Bears went up 51-48 on a jumper by Ronnie Rousseau III but could not convert another field goal down the stretch.

NDSU tied the game, 52-52, on a floater by Jacobson with 2:58 remaining and then crept ahead by two on a pair of foul shots by Tyson Ward a minute later. MSU's Ryan Kreklow sank two clutch charity shots of his own at the 1:54 mark to knot the score for the last time, 54-54.

The Bison gained the edge on two free throws by Jacobson, and then both clubs went cold in the final 90 seconds.

With NDSU creeping ahead by three on a foul shot by Ward with 8.5 ticks showing, Johnson brought the ball down the court and picked up his dribble with time winding down. He found a streaking Jarrid Rhodes whose potential game-tying 3-pointer from the right wing looked on target, but just rimmed out as the final horn sounded.

Johnson was 8-of-21, and Reggie Scurry was 4-for-9 from the field, but the rest of the Bears combined to go 8-for-31 in a classic, defensive battle. For the night, MSU converted 32.8 percent overall and just 1-of-17 from long range.

Johnson's 20 rebounds was just one shy of a career high in his second straight double-double of the young campaign.

The Bears started the night in hibernation, missing their first three shots before Johnson converted a fast-break layup for the first points of the game nearly three-and-a-half minutes in.

Rhodes and Obediah Church followed suit to give MSU a 6-2 lead out of the gates as the Bison missed nine of their first 10 attempts.

After a Ryan Kreklow jumper at the 12:38 mark put the Bears up 8-5, NDSU went on a 14-1 run over the next six minutes to take a 19-9 advantage. MSU ended the dry spell with back-to-back buckets by Johnson, including a steal and layup to get within six.

After Jacobson's third trey of the opening half gave NDSU a 22-13 lead with just over five minutes to go, the Bears ended the stanza on a 9-2 run to get within 24-22 at the intermission. Church, Scurry and Jarred Dixon led the surge, including a huge triple by Dixon with 30 seconds to go before the break.

Alize Johnson scored 17 points and snagged a game-high 14 rebounds, but a second-half streak by unbeaten Georgia Southern helped hand the Bears a 74-73 loss in the opening round of the Gulf Coast Showcase at Germain Arena.

The Bears took their first lead of the game with 16:39 remaining on a 3-pointer by Ryan Kreklow to bring MSU all the way back from an early 12-point hole.

The lead see-sawed back and forth over the next four minutes before the Eagles went on a decisive 13-2 run to push ahead 67-57 on a tip-in by Sean O'Connell with just over eight minutes to play. GSU then scored four of the game's next five points to take its biggest lead of the afternoon, 71-58 at the 6:44 mark.

During that pivotal 10-minute stretch, the Bears committed six turnovers and put themselves in a difficult predicament. But in a game full of key scoring runs, the Bears saved their best for last, hitting on all cylinders over the game's final six minutes.

With the Bears' defense stepping up its efforts, Reggie Scurry started MSU's late scoring run with a traditional 3-point play, followed by a flashy layup by J.T. Miller. Miller later scored high off the glass with less than two minutes to go, and then MSU had a pivotal sequence off a GSU miss with just over a minute to play. Obediah Church blocked a shot by Tookie Brown which Johnson corralled and fed to a streaking Miller to get MSU within 73-68.

Miller than made it a 73-70 game with a huge dunk at the 34-second mark.

Brown, who had a game-high 20 points, then missed the front end of a one-andone with 18.4 seconds to go to give MSU a chance to tie. After a long possession, Johnson lined up a potential game-tying three from the top of the key, but it missed just long.

GSU's Ike Smith gathered the rebound and was fouled with 5.6 seconds to play. He was sent to the line and made the first free throw, but missed the second. MSU rushed down the floor, and Jarrid Rhodes knocked down a clutch triple from the right wing to get MSU closer, but time expired before the Bears could foul again.

Miller scored a season-high 17 points for MSU, while Rhodes added 11 playing n his home state.

The Bears finished with 17 turnovers, shot 48.3 percent from the field on 28-of-58 shots and dropped in a season-best 76.5 percent (13-of-17) from the foul line. Aside from Ronnie Rousseau III, who was 2-for-2 from beyond the arc, the Bears were cold from long range, making just 4-of-18 (.222) threes as a team.

Missouri State out-rebounded Georgia Southern by a 42-35 margin.

In the first half, the Eagles jumped out to an 18-6 lead in the first five minutes to help the Sun Belt squad take a 44-38 lead into the intermission.

Alize Johnson's layup with 12 seconds remaining helped guide the Missouri State Bears to a 69-65 comeback win over Manhattan in the second round of the Gulf Coast Showcase.

Johnson led all scorers with 17 points and finished a perfect 7-for-7 at the line. MSU also got 12 points apiece from J.T. Miller and Obediah Church who each added five field goals.

The Bears led for the game's first 10 minutes, but fell behind after the Jaspers' amped up their full-court pressure to take MSU of its offensive rhythm. However, with just over six minutes to go in the game, Obediah Church's dunk in transition brought MSU all the way back from a nine-point deficit to tie the game at 57.

Manhattan recaptured the lead briefly, but the game's final four minutes belonged to the Bears. Ronnie Rousseau III knocked down two key free throws to get MSU closer before Miller tied the game, 61-61, on a running floater with just 3:45 to play.

Church added another big dunk a minute later to give the Bears their first lead since the opening half, but the Jaspers tied it again after Rich Williams was fouled by Miller and made both free throws. With 1:44 to play, Johnson scored on a putback off a missed corner three by Kreklow to put MSU up 65-63.

That score held up until the final 40 seconds when Manhattan's Williams tied the game again on a challenged 15-foot jumper to make it 65-65. The Bears called a timeout at the 28-second mark to set up what proved to be the winning play – Johnson's layup with a dozen ticks to go.

Manhattan used its final timeout at 5.3 seconds before the final buzzer, but the Bears snuffed out the set play, and Kreklow gathered in a loose ball to end the threat. He iced the game's final two free throws to help hand MSU a four-point victory.

MSU held the Jaspers to just 29 percent shooting in the second half and forced seven turnovers in that span to set up the comeback. The Bears also scored 13 second-half field goals compared to just seven by Manhattan.

Church scored all 12 of his points in the final stanza, going 5-for-5 from the field with 5 caroms and a pair of blocks down the stretch. For his part, Johnson was also key in the clutch, making 4-of-6 second-half shots while helping MSU out-rebound MC by a 22-15 margin in that span.

For the game, the Bears finished 24-of-55 (.436) overall from the field and a season-best 20-of-25 (.800) at the foul line. MSU also enjoyed a 37-29 rebounding advantage with just 11 turnovers in a defensive-oriented contest.

After firing an impressive 55 percent from the field in the first half, Manhattan finished 23-for-53 (.434) from the field and 8-of-19 (.421) from three. The Jaspers got 15 points apiece from Aaron Walker and Rich Williams in a solid team effort.

Missouri State got 14 points apiece from Jarrid Rhodes and Alize Johnson and rode the strength of five significant runs to put away Florida Atlantic, 71-60, in the consolation championship game of the Gulf Case Showcase.

Johnson snagged a team-high 8 rebounds and dished out 4 assists, while Rhodes knocked down three 3-pointers for MSU. The Bears also got 10 points apiece from J.T. Miller and Jarred Dixon.

FAU got a game-high 16 points from Gerdarius Troutman, who was 4-for-5 from long range, and 10 rebounds from Amir Smith.

After leading 36-28 at the midway point, the Bears opened up the second half with a 7-0 run that Johnson ignited with a mid-range jumper. Ronnie Rousseau III followed that up with a 3-pointer, and Rhodes converted a layup to push the Bears ahead, 43-28, less than 90 seconds into the final period.

The Bears' lead grew to 20 points later in the half on a 10-2 outburst by the Springfield club. Dixon and Reggie Scurry contributed four points apiece in the run that made it 55-35 with 12:31 to play.

MSU's defense kept the Owls without a field goal for more than seven minutes midway through the second half, and Dixon's jumper with 8:24 to play gave the Bears their biggest lead of the afternoon, 63-40.

Obediah Church threw home a one-handed dunk on a long, laser-like pass from Johnson with seven-and-a-half minutes to go that put the Bears up 65-43.

FAU responded with a 10-0 run, but victory was assured with solid free throw shooting by Miller and Ryan Kreklow in the clutch, while Johnson ended a five-minute field goal drought by the Bears to put things on ice.

Missouri State held FAU to just 35.6 percent shooting for the game on 21-of-59 attempts while using impressive defensive runs to force 12 turnovers and out-rebound the Owls by a 45-31 margin.

MSU finished 29-of-63 (.460), including an even 50-percent in the second half, and converting 9-of-12 (.750) from the stripe with 16 assists.

In the first half, the bigger Owls jumped out to a 9-3 lead before MSU used a 12-4 run over the next six minutes to lead 15-13. Baskets by Miller, Scurry and two by Rousseau sparked an 8-0 Bears' run in a stretch that changed the tides.

FAU retook the lead briefly, 17-15, midway through the opening period, but the Bears rallied behind a Johnson-led 6-0 rally to push back in front.

With under three minutes left in the half, Rhodes sparked an 11-2 run before the intermission with a pair of 3-pointers and a layup. His four-point play with 33 seconds left in the half made it a 36-25 game before FAU canned a triple before the final horn to send the Bears to a 36-28 lead at the break.

All 11 Missouri State players in uniform found the scoring column, including a team-high 13 points by Jarred Dixon, to lead the Bears past Evangel, 80-48.

J.T. Miller, Obediah Church and Reggie Scurry also added 10 points apiece for MSU, which shot an even 50 percent from the field and out-rebounded the Crusaders by a 50-29 margin.

The game was the home guarantee as part of MSU's entry into the recent-ly-completed Gulf Coast Showcase in Florida. It was also the Bears' fourth game in a five-day span.

Paul Lusk's club led wire-to-wire and jumped out of the gates to a 20-5 lead in the first 10 minutes. A close-range by Miller just over two minutes in gave the transfer from Howard University his 1,000th career point.

Nearly 13 minutes into the game, the Bears opened up a 21-point advantage on a traditional 3-point play by Church, who snagged a game-high 10 rebounds for his second career double-double.

Evangel responded with an 8-0 run powered by Jalen Norman and Justin Washington to get its deficit back to 13.

But right before the intermission, the home club rallied again, getting a dunk by Scurry to start things before a dunk-back by Church and a trey by Dixon – his first of three on the night.

The second half proved much the same with Ross Owens giving the Bears their first 30-point lead on a mid-range jumper at the 8:06 mark. Owens and Ryan Kreklow added triples in the final five minutes before Scurry put MSU over 80 points for the third time this season with a close-range bucket in the final minute.

The Bears knocked down eight 3-pointers for the game, their most since Nov. 15 against Southern, and accounted for 44 points in the paint and 34 bench points in picking up their third straight win.

Kreklow led MSU with 4 assists, Mustafa Lawrence tallied 3 steals, and Church added 5 blocked shots to his already-impressive stat line.

Evangel was led by Washington's game-high 19 points on 8-of-24 shooting and a team-high 6 rebounds.

Ryan Kreklow scored a career-high 20 points, and Missouri State held off a late surge by visiting Colorado State to lead the Bears to a 77-67 victory as part of the Mountain West-Missouri Valley Conference Challenge series.

The Bears, who never trailed, also got 12 points from Reggie Scurry and 10 points and 8 rebounds from Obediah Church to help secure the win.

Prentiss Nixon tallied 20 points for Colorado State (3-4), which also got 14 points from Deion James and 13 from Che Bob. Bob notched a game-high 12 rebounds for the Rams.

The Bears jumped out to an 8-2 lead early and then extended their advantage to 20-8 at the midway point of the first half after back-to-back 3-pointers by Jarrid Rhodes and Kreklow.

Kreklow finished 3-of-6 from bonus distance on the night.

MSU kept the pressure on the visitors and used a 5-0 run that included a steal and layup by Jarred Dixon to lead 25-9. The Bears would match their biggest lead of the opening stanza – 16 points – five more times, including a buzzer-beating layup by Tanveer Bhullar just before the intermission.

Colorado State made things interesting with a 7-0 run to start the second half, but the Bears responded three minutes into the final period with a triple from Rhodes and a close-range bucket by Church to get the MSU edge back to 14.

MSU's lead grew to as many as 20 with 7:50 to play on a transition trey by Kreklow that followed a corner three by Ronnie Rousseau III moments earlier.

MSU then went the next three minutes without a field goal while CSU chipped away. J.T. Miller's jumper with 4:41 to play made it a 67-55 game to stop the bleeding, but the Rams answered with a quick 4-0 outburst to cut their deficit to eight.

With two minutes remaining, CSU scored on back-to-back dunks by Bob and James that made the score 69-63 with 1:47 to play, and when James kissed the glass with a short jumper at the 1:29 to go, it trimmed MSU's advantage to 69-65.

But the final minute belonged to the home club. Rhodes, Kreklow and Dixon each contributed clutch free throws down the stretch as MSU converted 8-of-10 from the stripe and got a series of defensive stops to put the double-figure win on ice.

MSU was out-rebounded for the first time, 41-36, but dominated the pine with 46 bench points to CSU's 6. MSU's junior class combined for 51 points from Kreklow, Church, Scurry and Dixon, to help cushion the scoring load with the club's top point producer Alize Johnson held scoreless for the just the second time in his career.

The Bears held Colorado State to just 35.9 percent shooting (23-of-64) overall and 4-of-23 (.174) from long range. MSU also did a great job at the foul line, converting 23-of-29 (.793) from the stripe and 43.4 percent (23-of-53) overall.

Alize Johnson had game highs with 20 points and 14 rebounds to pace Missouri State past South Dakota State, 73-53, at the Stanford Pentagon, extending MSU's win streak to five games.

The Bears shot 48.4 percent from the field and never trailed, marking the club's third straight wire-to-wire victory.

After Missouri State ended the first half on a 7-0 run to lead 43-26 at the midway point, South Dakota State scored the first five points of the second half to get back within 12

The Jackrabbits closed their deficit to 10 twice from there, first on a traditional 3-point play by Brandon Key with just over 13 minutes to play, and then on a close-range bucket by Tevin King at the 12:41 mark.

But MSU had an answer for the surge by SDSU, which was playing just 58 miles from its campus in Brookings. J.T. Miller started a 10-2 run by the Bears over the next three minutes that included three jumpers by Reggie Scurry to give MSU its biggest lead to that point, 58-40, midway through the second half.

King then went on a personal 5-0 run for the Jackrabbits to make it 58-45, but MSU's defense would hold SDSU without a field goal for most of the next six minutes while pushing ahead by as many as 22 with close-range buckets from Miller, Johnson and Obediah Church down the stretch.

Scurry finished with 14 points in 15 minutes, while Church was a perfect 3-for-3 from the field to account for 6 points and 6 rebounds. With four first-half 3-pointers, Jarrid Rhodes also finished in double figures for MSU with 12 points.

King led South Dakota State's efforts with 13 points, while Reed Tellinghuisen has 12 points. Highly-touted NBA prospect Mike Daum finished 3-for-14 from the field for 7 points and just 3 rebounds.

MSU out-rebounded SDSU by a 41-30 margin and held the Jacks to just 35.6 percent shooting from the field (21-for-59) and 12.5 percent (3-of-24) from three.

The Bears set a blistering pace in the first half, shooting 51.6 percent from the field with 9 treys to lead by 17 at the intermission.

Johnson knocked down two 3-pointers in the first two minutes of the game to set the early standard. Around the five-minute mark, Ryan Kreklow and Rhodes drained long-range bombs after Johnson's third triple to push the Bears up 34-21. Finally after an MSU timeout with 1:38 left in the opening stanza, MSU came out with a layup by Church, a triple by Rhodes – his fourth of the half – and a buzzer-beating jumper by Kreklow to lead 43-26 at the midway point.

It was just NDSU's third loss ever at the newly-renovated Scheels Center. Blizzard-like conditions at game time held the night's attendance to just 1,704.

After battling tooth and nail for the first 32 minutes, the Bears (8-2) closed out the game on an 18-6 run after NDSU made it a 53-52 game with just under eight minutes to play. After Chris Quayle's jumper at 7:57 got the Bison within one, MSU came out of the under-eight media timeout with a triple by Jarrid Rhodes, a layup and free throw by Reggie Scurry and elbow jumper by Ronnie Rousseau III to take a 63-52 edge and force an NDSU timeout.

MSU stretched its lead to double figures for the first time on the ensuing possession on a layup by Scurry on a great bounce pass by Ryan Kreklow that made it 63-52 with 4:20 to play.

Paul Miller hit a couple of free throws and a layup for the home side in the final four minutes, but Johnson took over down the stretch with a one-handed 10-footer and then a clutch 3-pointer with 1:25 to play for MSU.

With less than a minute to go, Scurry completed a traditional 3-point play on a strong move to the rim and dunk to make it 71-56 with 39 seconds remaining.

Scurry finished with 13 points, while Jarrid Rhodes added 11 for the Bears. Johnson posted his fifth double-double of the young season, while Scurry added 7 rebounds to help MSU to a 42-26 advantage on the glass.

Miller led NDSU with 16 points as the only Bison player to score in double figures. MSU held NDSU to just 39.6 percent from the field (21-for-53) and 8-of-27 (.296) from long range.

In the first half, MSU went to the locker room on a 12-2 run, culminated by a buzzer-beating 3-pointer by Jarred Dixon to lead, 37-32, at the game's midway point.

Dixon scored the game's opening basket to give MSU the early lead, but NDSU reeled off the next eight to build an early 8-2 edge.

MSU kept it close with solid defense from there, but five straight times the Bears got within two points of the lead, the Bison answered with a clutch 3-pointer, including twice by Quayle.

The Bears finally broke through on a hook shot by J.T. Miller with just under three minutes left in the half before Rhodes tied the game, 30-30, with a 3-pointer. NDSU retook the lead briefly on a hook shot by Deng Geu, but MSU scored the final six points of the half thanks to a pair of steals by Kreklow and buckets by Obediah Church, Scurry and the buzzer-beater by Dixon.

Missouri State got 17 points apiece from Jarred Dixon and Alize Johnson to help the Bears turn back visiting Hampton, 88-75.

MSU, which extended its win streak to seven games, shot 48.5 percent from the field with four double-figure scorers – including 11 by J.T. Miller and 10 by Jarrid Rhodes – to overcome Hampton's hot shooting.

Hampton converted 53.1 percent in the first half to stay within seven of the Bears at the half, but MSU used a pair of threes by Dixon and a 7-1 run early in the second period to push ahead by 16 with 12:47 to play.

The Bears switched to a zone defense the second half to try to keep Hampton's Jermaine Marrow and Kalin Fisher in check. Marrow finished with a game-high 29 points after a 17-point first half, while Fisher tallied 15 points. The tandem combined for seven of the Pirates' 11 treys on the night.

Midway through the second half, three different Bears pitched in as part of a decisive 11-0 run in the span of two minutes. Leading 65-54 at the time, the Bears exploded like a cannon shot with Miller and Ronnie Rousseau III knocking down treys, Johnson tossing in a pair of foul shots, and Miller scoring on a traditional 3-point play to make it 76-54 at the 9:18 mark.

Missouri State used another 8-0 run in the final four minutes to stretch their lead to the largest of the night with Dixon hitting his final trey and Reggie Scurry collecting a 3-point play and a dunk to make it 88-64 with 3:27 to go.

MSU shot a JQH Arena record 68.4 percent from 3-point range, making 13-of-19 shots from bonus distance on a night that also saw the home club throw down five dunks. The Bears also out-rebounded Hampton by double figures, 40-29, with Johnson posting his sixth double-double of the year with a game-high 12 caroms.

For its part, Hampton stayed in the game by making tough shots. Marrow converted 10-of-18 attempts overall but 4-of-5 from beyond the arc. As a team, the Pirates converted 11-of-21 (.524) from bonus distance.

The first half was an offensive sprint with the Bears outrunning the Pirates, 49-42, to the midway point. Johnson posted 13 first-half points – including three treys.

After the Bears took a 21-14 lead seven minutes into the game on a triple by Ryan Kreklow, Hampton scored six of their next eight field goals from beyond the arc to stay within reach.

The Bears ended the half on a 7-2 run to push ahead by seven, thanks to a dunk by Obediah Church, a three by Jarrid Rhodes and a transition jumper by Dixon.

Oral Roberts hit four 3-pointers in the final 10 minutes and used a decisive 9-2 run midway through the final stanza to take down the Missouri State Bears, 73-66.

Missouri State got 14 points and 5 rebounds from Jarrid Rhodes, while J.T. Miller added 13 points.

The Bears led for more than 19 minutes and by as many as 11 points, but could not get defensive stops down the stretch.

MSU led 38-34 at the intermission and held off an early 5-0 outburst by the Golden Eagles to retake the lead on a trey by Jarred Dixon with just under 13 minutes to go. ORU then tied the game, 47-47, on a triple by Emmenuel Nzekwesi before Alize Johnson put MSU up again on a close-range bucket with 12:14 remaining.

Oral Roberts then went on a 9-2 surge over the next three minutes to lead 56-51, and the visitors would never lead again.

Missouri State climbed within a possession of the lead six times over the next five minutes, including three critical scores from Miller. But each time the Bears got close, Oral Roberts (3-9) had an answer.

After Johnson brought the Bears back within 65-62 on a 3-pointer, ORU's Sam Kearns hit back-to-back threes to put the Golden Eagles up 68-62 with 4:05 to go.

The Bears would get within four on baskets by Miller and Reggie Scurry down the stretch, but a tough traveling call on Dixon in the final minute and four straight empty possessions sealed MSU's fate. Missouri State did not score in the last minute. 44 seconds of the contest.

Missouri State's usually-stingy defense allowed ORU to convert 53.1 percent of its field goals (26-of-49), by far a season high by a Bears' opponent. The Golden Eagles also made 9-of-20 (.450) from beyond the arc and got to the foul line 13 more times than MSU.

Missouri State finished 26-of-57 (.456) from the field and 7-of-24 (.292) from long range. The Bears out-rebounded the home club, 35-26, to help MSU tally 15 second-chance points. MSU also posted 14 assists, including a career-high 7 by Dixon.

ORU got 26 points in the paint, including a game-high 17 by Nzekwesi. Javan White added 14 points, and Kearns scored 13 with 8 assists.

The Bears started the afternoon slowly, rallying from an early seven-point deficit before the first media timeout to tie the game on a jumper by Scurry less than six minutes in. MSU extended its lead to as many as 11 in the first half, using a 7-0 run over a three-minute span to push ahead 33-22 after a triple by Ryan Kreklow.

Late in the half, ORU's Emir Ahmedric had the hot hand, scoring six straight points to get the home side within 36-31 before the Golden Eagles ended the half with a trey by Kearns to make it a 38-34 contest at the midway point..

Missouri State used solid defense and clutch rebounding to turn back visiting Wright State, 66-50, in the Bears' final non-conference matchup.

MSU did not allow a field goal in the final 7 minutes, 45 seconds, forcing the Raiders into 20 consecutive missed shots to end the game. WSU finished just 18-of-64 (.281) from the field after cutting the Bears' advantage to 53-48 on a 3-pointer by Jaylon Hall with WSU's final bucket.

Obediah Church started MSU's march to the finish line from there, making 2-of-3 free throws on the home club's next two possessions and then converting a layup with just under five minutes to go. When Jarrid Rhodes beat the shot clock with a bucket at the four-minute mark, it pushed MSU's lead to double figures, 59-48.

Church, who finished with a team-high 13 points, then put the exclamation mark on the win with a dunk back with 93 seconds remaining – his third slam of the night.

Alize Johnson posted his seventh double-double of the campaign for Missouri State, scoring 12 points and collecting a game-high 14 rebounds, while Rhodes also added 12 points.

In the first half, the Bears set a blistering pace, using a 9-0 run over a four-anda-half minute spell to build a 15 point lead. Church's dunk with 8:41 left in the opening stanza made it a 23-8 contest.

Before the intermission, a put-back by Ross Owens, another dunk by Church and a trey by Rhodes pushed the home side ahead, 34-13, the Bears' biggest lead of the night.

Wright State, which had won seven of eight heading into the game, opened the second half on a 10-2 run to trim MSU's lead to 10 before the first media timeout. Rhodes and Church teamed up to build the Bears' advantage back to 14 before another 8-2 run by the visitors sliced Missouri State's lead to 42-33.

The final push by WSU came with a 12-4 outburst, which was capped by Hall's trey at the 7:45 mark that made it a five-point game.

Missouri State out-rebounded Wright State by a 42-40 margin with the Raiders accounting for 11 second-chance points on 15 offensive caroms.

The Bears, the third MVC team to 10 non-conference wins, had 14 assists, including 4 by Johnson, 11 turnovers, 32 points in the paint and 6 blocked shots. MSU finished 26-of-56 (.464) from the field, 6-of-16 (.375) from bonus range and 8-of-14 (.571) at the stripe.

Dec. 22, 2017, JQH Arena, Springfield, Mo. Missouri State 64, Loyola Chicago 59

A lob from Ryan Kreklow to Reggie Scurry with 1:12 to play gave Missouri State a five-point lead and helped the Bears to a 64-59 win over Loyola.

Scurry finished with a career high 18 off the bench to go with 7 rebounds, while teammate Alize Johnson notched a game-high 24 points, 11 rebounds and 5 3-pointers as MSU improved to 11-3 overall.

Loyola, which came in with a Valley-best 52.2 field goal percentage on the season, was held to just 44.2 percent shooting on the evening and 20 percent from 3-point range. Freshman Cameron Krutwig led the Ramblers with 18 points and 5 rebounds, while Margues Townes added 14 points.

Missouri State led the entire first half, extending its lead to 10 twice, before going into the locker room with a 33-26 halftime lead. But Loyola came out on fire to start the second half, reeling off an 8-0 run to gain its first lead, 34-33, with 17:38 to go.

The lead would change hands five more times before MSU took it back for good on a traditional 3-point play by Scurry with 8:41 to play. The Ramblers were game, however, rallying within a point of the lead twice more, first on a put-back by Adarius Avery with 8 minutes to play, and later on a hook shot by Krutwig with just three-and-a-half minutes on the clock.

Johnson extended the Bears' lead to three on a close-range shot around the three-minute mark, and with MSU's defense kicking into overdrive down the stretch, Kreklow's lob to Scurry on an in-bound play seemed to put things on ice.

Ronnie Rousseau III added a pair of free throws for MSU with 26 seconds to play, and on Loyola's next possession, the Ramblers missed a pair of 3-pointers before Scurry gathered in the rebound and was fouled.

The junior made one of two from the stripe to push MSU's lead to six, and LUC's final free throw came with less than a second on the clock to give the Bears a five-point win. Loyola was just 1-of-7 from the field down the stretch.

MSU out-rebounded Loyola by a 32-30 margin and made good on 8-of-19 (.421) 3-pointers and 22-of-51 (.431) shots overall from the field.

Johnson's posted his eighth double-double of the season and 25th of his MSU career, while Kreklow finished with 10 points, 5 assists and a pair of 3-pointers in his second straight start.

The Bears opened the game by connecting on their first six shots to take 15-7 lead just three-and-a-half minutes in. MSU made just 1 of its next 12 attempts from there, but weathered the storm. The home side kept its composure thanks in part to an 8-1 stretch late in the half that started with a dunk by Scurry and concluded with a corner trey by Jarred Dixon that put MSU up 29-20 at the time.

Kreklow's long three with 1:49 left in the opening half put the home side ahead 32-22, matching MSU's biggest lead of the game, and eventually went into the intermission with a 33-26 advantage.

Missouri State used a 13-0 outburst midway through the opening half to set a blistering pace and never looked back in a 67-50 win over Valparaiso.

The victory was Paul Lusk's 100th as head coach of the Bears, making him just the seventh MSU head coach to reach the century mark in wins.

The Bears were led by Jarrid Rhodes with 15 points, while Alize Johnson notched his ninth double-double of the campaign with 11 points and a game-high 12 rebounds. Obediah Church and Jarred Dixon added 10 points apiece for MSU.

Valparaiso shot just 34.8 percent from the field and turned the ball over 16 times thanks in part to solid defense from the Bears.

After Rhodes forced a Crusaders timeout with back-to-back 3-pointers to push MSU ahead 17-11, Valparaiso climbed back within 17-15 at the midway point of the opening half, But the Bears responded with 13 unanswered points over the next six minutes to lead 30-15.

The home club would get no closer than 12 the rest of the game.

Missouri State built its biggest lead midway through the second stanza with a 3-pointer by J.T. Miller than made it 56-29 with 10:06 to play. The Bears held serve from there until both teams cleared their benches in the final three minutes.

A buzzer-beating 3-pointer by Valparaiso's Max Joseph made the final margin 17. Joseph led the Crusaders with 13 points.

Rhodes was 5-of-9 from long range for the Bears, matching a career high from long distance, while MSU's 40-31 rebounding advantage was the club's 14th in 15 games.

Church added 4 blocked shots for the Bears, while Reggie Scurry added 9 points and 6 rebounds off the bench for the Bears who picked up their sixth win away from home.

For the game, Missouri State was 23-of-59 (.390) overall, 8-of-28 (.286) from downtown and 13-of-15 (.867) at the line with just 9 turnovers.

MSU held Valpo to 16-of-46 (.348) overall and 5-of-19 (.263) from long range. The Crusaders were 13-of-20 (.650) from the stripe with 20 points in the paint.

Alize Johnson scored 24 points and snagged 20 of his team's 51 rebounds to help Missouri State to a 62-55 win over visiting Northern Iowa. It was Johnson's second 20-20 game of the season and his 10th double-double.

Missouri State also got 13 points off the bench from J.T. Miller and 9 points from Jarrid Rhodes.

UNI got 18 points and 10 rebounds from Tywhon Pickford, while Klint Carlson posted 16 points.

The Bears added to their nine-point halftime lead with a 9-0 run early in the second half. The two-minute outburst included a drive to the rack by Ryan Kreklow, a steal and layup by Johnson, a trey by Rhodes and an offensive rebound and putback by Johnson that put MSU up by 17 with just over 14 minutes to play.

Miller scored six of MSU's eight points in a five-minute stretch from there, and Johnson's two free throws with 6:11 remaining gave the Bears their biggest lead of the night, 55-36.

The next three minutes belonged to UNI, which reeled off seven unanswered points before Johnson quieted the Panther rally with a short jumper. Bennett Koch's bucket with 2:33 to play made it a 57-45 contest with the visitors failing to surrender late in the contest.

Over the next two minutes, Missouri State missed six consecutive free throws to open the door for the Panthers who climbed back within 57-53 on a triple by Carlson with 27 seconds to go.

But MSU's starters showed composure when it counted. Johnson, Jarred Dixon and Kreklow teaming up to ice the Bears' final five charity shots of the night and secure the seven-point win.

The Bears out-rebounded UNI by a convincing 51-26 margin, including 17 on the offensive end. MSU also held the Panthers to just seven field goals in the first half and four 3-pointers on the night.

For its part, UNI made a game of it late with behind seniors Carlson and Koch who accounted for 11 combined points in the final five minutes.

The Bears were slow out of the gates to start the night, making just one of their first 10 shots and fell behind 9-4 early. A transition basket by Alize Johnson started MSU's comeback, and his layup with 5:48 to go in the opening half gave the Bears their first lead since the opening minute and started a 15-3 run over the next three-and-a-half minutes for the home club.

Northern lowa went six minutes without a field goal from there as MSU stepped up its defensive intensity and forced the Panthers to just 2-of-9 in the last nine minutes of the stanza.

Illinois State scored 10 points in the final two minutes and rallied to overcome a late Missouri State lead in a 72-68 Redbird victory.

MSU was led by Alize Johnson, Ronnie Rousseau III and J.T. Miller with 16 points apiece. Johnson, 12, and Miller, 11, were also in double-figures on the boards, marking Johnson's fifth straight-double double and his 11th of the year, while Miller notched his first-ever double-double.

MSU committed a season-high 18 turnovers, including 11 in the first half, which helped put the Bears in a 10-point deficit with just over 17 minutes to play.

However, solid defensive pressure from there gave Missouri State a chance, holding ISU to just four field goals in its first 17 attempts of the second half. Meanwhile, a 3-pointer by Jarred Dixon with nine minutes left got the Bears within 51-49, and three minutes later, a tip-in by Miller made it a 54-53 game.

The Bears were finally able to overcome the ample free throw chances by ISU with 4:33 to go as Miller scored on a put-back after a missed Bears' 3-pointer. His two free throws less than a minute later gave Missouri State a 59-56 advantage with 3:46 to play.

But, Illinois State rallied with a pair of free throws, then tied the game on a closerange bucket by Malik Yarbrough with 2:35 to go. Rousseau gave the lead back to the visitors on a driving layup at the 2:20 mark, but ISU's Phil Fayne knotted the score for the fourth and final time, 62-62, on an alley-oop dunk with just under two minutes remaining

The Redbirds turned to Fayne on their next two possessions for close-range shots and then made 6-of-9 from the stripe down the stretch to seal the win, extending their MVC home win streak to 16 straight.

For their part, Missouri State never surrendered in crunch time. Rousseau's 3-pointer from the corner with 8 seconds to go would have made it a two-point game, but video replay review changed the bucket to a two-pointer. Rousseau had another jumper down the stretch, and Dixon had a big layup that made it 70-68 with 1.4 seconds to go.

MSU's final attempt to stop the clock, a foul by Miller, was ruled as a flagrant foul, giving ISU two shots and the ball. As it turned out, Fayne – who was 9-of-10 at the stripe – missed his final attempt, which would have given the Bears the ball down three. Instead, the Bears had to foul again, and Yarbrough put it out of reach with one make.

Fayne and Yabrough finished with 23 points apiece for the Redbirds.

Missouri State out-rebounded ISU by a 40-27 margin and didn't allow the Redbirds any offensive rebounds in the second half after they tallied 13 second-chance points in the first half.

Missouri State cut its double-figure deficit down to three with just over a minute to play, but could not catch the Evansville Purple Aces, falling 64-55.

Alize Johnson led three Bears in double figures with 16 points and 14 rebounds, while Reggie Scurry and Jarrid Rhodes added 10 points apiece.

Evansville never trailed and was led by Dru Smith's 15 points, while Dainius Chatkevicius scored 10 points with a team-high 11 rebounds.

The Bears trailed by seven at the midway point, but a 9-3 run by the Aces before the first media timeout of the second half dug MSU into a 42-31 deficit.

The visitors climbed back within four on free throws by Ronnie Rousseau III at the 8:35 mark and later got within four again on a tip-in by Scurry at 7:50. But it wasn't until the final minute of play when Johnson knocked down his second triple of the night, that MSU was able to get within 58-55.

But even that wasn't enough to break Evansville. The Bears would fail to score again, while UE tacked on six free throws in the clutch to secure the win.

MSU was out-rebounded for just the second time this season, coming up on the short end of a 38-31 Aces advantage on the glass

Missouri State struggled out of the gates, missing its first six shots before Scurry, in his first career start, scored one off the glass nearly six minutes in. With just under 10 minutes left in the opening half, Rhodes converted a four-point play to get MSU within 12-10, and a layup by Jarrid Dixon a minute later kept MSU within 14-12

But an 8-0 run by the Purple Aces that covered two minutes proved to be the difference in the first period. A pair of triples by Ryan Taylor and a steal and layup from John Hall made it a 22-12 game. UE would eventually lead by 11 after a trey by Smith, but Missouri State held the Aces without a field goal for the final four minutes of the opening half and went into the intermission down 31-24.

For the night, MSU was 21-for-58 (.362) from the field, 7-of-22 (.318) from three and 6-of-7 (.857) in its limited chances at the stripe. The Bears also committed 13 turnovers, five in the second half, and snagged seven steals.

Evansville made 22-of-48 (.458) from the field, 4-of-11 (.364) from bonus range, including three by Taylor, and converted 16-of-23 (.696) at the foul line with 14 turnovers

Taylor finished with 13 points, while Evansville also got 11 points from R.J. Riley. Noteworthy for the Bears was Johnson's sixth straight double-double. Obediah Church's streak of 38 straight starts was broken as he sat out with a nagging knee issue. And, senior Tanveer Bhullar, who had missed the previous four games due to a team rules suspension, returned to action and scored a first-half basket.

The Bears were led by Alize Johnson's 21 points and 16 rebounds. He and Ryan Kreklow each contributed three charity shots in the final minutes to help ice the win, while Jarred Dixon scored 15 for the home club.

Missouri State led by 10 at the half and extended its advantage to a game-best 11 points midway through the second half on back-to-back 3-pointers by Johnson and a free throw by J.T. Miller that made it 57-46.

ISU then ripped off eight unanswered points over the next three minutes to make it a 57-54 contest. The Bears called a timeout and immediately went back to Miller whose driving layup gave MSU some breathing room with just under 8 minutes left.

The Bears clung to a narrow advantage until a triple by Demonte Ojinnaka, his second of the afternoon, gave the Sycamores their first lead of the day, 63-62. Johnson and Dixon knotted the score with free throws on Missouri State's next two trips, but another ISU 3-pointer, this time by Barnes, with 2:26 to play gave the visitors their biggest lead, 68-65.

Missouri State rallied in the final two minutes, getting a runner by Ronnie Rousseau III to close the gap to one, and then retaking the lead, 69-68, on a floater by Dixon with 1:23 to play. Indiana State missed its next three shots, which the Bears turned into four unanswered points at the foul line – three by Johnson and one by Rousseau – to push the Bears ahead by five.

But with 6.1 seconds to play, Barnes knocked down his fourth trey of the game, to keep the visitors within striking distance, 73-71. Kreklow was quickly fouled with 5.2 seconds remaining and made one of two to get MSU's lead back to three.

Down the stretch, the Bears fouled Barnes before Indiana State could get across half court and attempt a potential game-tying three. Barnes made both free throws to make it a one-point contest, but MSU was able to inbound the ball to Kreklow with two ticks, and he iced the victory by making both free throws in the clutch.

Missouri State converted 46.3 percent of its field goal attempts (25-of-54) on the game, matching their best so far in league play, while knocking down 6-of-19 (.316) threes and 20-of-29 (.690) free throws with a 33-29 edge in rebounding.

In the first half, both teams were slow getting started, but a layup by Church and 3-point play by Johnson gave MSU a five-point advantage six minutes in. Later, a 10-0 run by Missouri State over a three-minute stretch pushed the home club ahead 16-6 with 8:49 left in the opening stanza.

ISU knocked down three treys over the next four minutes to stay close, but it was back-to-back triples by Krelow before the intermission that put MSU up 40-30 at the midway point.

Missouri State used the momentum of an 18-3 second-half run to overcome an early deficit and dispatch visiting Valparaiso, 64-57, to complete the season sweep of the Missouri Valley Conference newcomers.

MSU was led by senior Alize Johnson who posted his eighth straight double-double with 24 points and 17 rebounds to lead all players. Jarred Dixon added 12 points in the winning cause.

Valpo got 12 points off the bench from Markus Golder and 10 from Tevonn Walker. The Bears trailed by nine in the first half, by five at halftime and fell behind 35-28 early in the second half before Johnson and the home club began chipping away. Johnson hit 3-pointers on back-to-back possessions and then threw down a dunk to get MSU within three. J.T. Miller tacked on a free throw to make it 39-37.

Just over four minutes later, Dixon gave MSU its first lead since 20-18 when he scored a traditional 3-point play to make it 45-43.

Dixon and Johnson would continue to rally the troops on the offensive end, while Jarrid Rhodes, Ryan Kreklow, Ronnie Rousseau III, Obediah Church and a host of others amped up the defensive pressure. By the time, Church threw down an uncontested dunk with 4:51 left in the game, Missouri State led 57-46 – its biggest advantage of the night.

Thanks to Walker, Max Joseph and Bakari Evelyn, the Crusaders made one last charge and climbed within 58-54 with 1:52 to play. But Johnson stepped up on the defensive end and drew a charge on Golder with just 76 seconds remaining and put a damper on Valpo's hopes.

Dixon iced 5-of-6 free throws in the final minute to stretch the MSU advantage to seven and help the Bears improve to 9-1 at JQH Arena this season.

Missouri State out-rebounded its 18th opponent of the campaign, boasting a 43-37 edge on the glass, while holding Valpo to just 35.5 percent from the field and 19 percent from long range.

The Bears converted 44 percent of their shots in the second half and finished 24-of-56 (.429) overall. MSU overcame a slow start from long range, going 4-of-9 in the second half and 5-of-21 overall from 3-point distance.

Church finished with 8 points, 6 rebounds and 2 blocks in his return to the starting rotation, while Reggie Scurry came off the bench to add 7 points and 5 boards. Rhodes also added 6 boards for MSU.

In the first half, Valparaiso used runs of 11-0 and 12-2 to take a 31-26 lead into the intermission. After the Crusaders built a 13-4 advantage seven minutes in, the Bears rallied with a 10-0 outburst of their own, capitalized by a Scurry jumper to push MSU up 18-15 at the 7:46 mark.

Scurry tied the game, 22-22, with just over three minutes left before the break on a short bucket off the window. But Valpo was game and reeled off the next seven straight points, including four by Evelyn to take the lead at the midway point.

The Bears were led by Jarrid Rhodes and Jarred Dixon who scored 15 points apiece, while J.T. Miller added 11 off the bench.

The game featured nine ties and four lead changes, but the last six minutes were the most dramatic.

Pippen then drained a 10-footer with 46 seconds remaining to push the visitors ahead by two, before Johnson tied the game again, 77-77, just 12 seconds later.

But on SIU's final trip, the Salukis got the ball to Pippen who hit Fletcher slashing to the basket for the game-winning layup.

Missouri State was able to launch one last shot before the final buzzer, but Jarrid Rhodes' desperation three from the left wing bounced off the rim.

MSU was out-rebounded for the third straight game as SIU took a 26-22 advantage on the glass with just three offensive rebounds.

After trailing by 11 at the half, Missouri State shot 58 percent in the second period and made 10-of-12 at the line in the final 20 minutes to help mount the comeback. The Bears finished 25-of-53 (.472) from the field, 11-of-27 (.407) from three and 16-of-18 (.889) at the line with just eight turnovers.

Missouri State's reserves provided some needed relief on a night when few shots seemed to fall for the Bears. Led by J.T. Miller and Mustafa Lawrence, who scored 12 points apiece, the MSU bench accounted for half of the home club's points in a 76-60 Missouri Valley Conference setback to Illinois State.

The Redbirds got 15 points apiece from Malik Yarbrough and Keyshawn Evans to lead five Illinois State players in double figures. ISU also knocked down 11 3-pointers – four by Madison Williams -- and out-rebounded the Bears by a 45-39 margin.

Missouri State never led after shooting just 28.1 percent in the first half and trailing by 11 at the midway point.

The second half opened with ISU reeling off five unanswered tallies to push ahead 35-21, but a 5-0 rally led by Obediah Church and Jarrid Rhodes got the Bears within 35-26 with over 16 minutes to play.

But the Redbirds drained 3-pointers on their next three possessions to push ahead by 18 in the span of just over two minutes. Evans, Taylor Bruninga and Williams all buried long-range buckets to make it 44-26 with 14:09 remaining.

That surge started a 24-8 series by the visiting club that culminated with nine minutes to play and the Redbirds up by 25, MSU's largest deficit of the season.

Miller, Ryan Kreklow and Lawrence then emerged from the MSU bench to light a spark for the maroon-clad Bears, eventually cutting the deficit in half with a minute to go

Lawrence nearly doubled his season scoring total behind a 3-for-3 effort from 3-point range, while Miller finished 6-for-14 with 6 rebounds. Tanveer Bhullar was also solid in reserve for MSU, registering 4 points and 4 rebounds with a pair of steals in a 13-minute assignment.

Missouri State, which dropped its fourth straight, finished 21-of-65 (.323) overall and 4-of-23 (.174) from bonus distance. The Bears converted 14-of-20 (.700) at the stripe with 16 offensive rebounds and 30 points in the paint.

Alize Johnson also scored 12 points for Missouri State and gathered in a gamehigh 10 rebounds for his 16th double-double of the year.

In the first half, the Bears used a 7-2 run over a three-minute span to trim a nine-point deficit to four. Bhullar's layup at the 7:48 mark of the first half made it a 17-13 game.

From there, the Redbirds got back-to-back treys from Bruninga and Yarbrough to push the visitors ahead by 10. MSU reeled off six unanswered points from there with Johnson scoring on a 3-point play and a transition bucket before Jarrid Rhodes tossed in a free throw to make it 23-19. But ISU ended the half on a 7-2 string to lead 30-21 at the game's midway point.

League-leading Loyola shot 61 percent from the field and out-rebounded visiting Missouri State by 11 en route to a 97-75 victory over the Bears.

The Ramblers had six players score in double figures, including Clayton Custer who produced a game-high 23 points on 9-of-11 shooting with 6 assists.

MSU, which shot 51 percent for the game, had four players score in double figures. Freshman Mustafa Lawrence drained five 3-pointers and finished with 19 points in his first-ever start and was second only to Custer in field goals made on the afternoon with seven. Lawrence also snagged three steals in 33 minutes.

The Bears trailed by nine at the midway point, but Loyola came out for the second half throwing haymakers with six field goals before the first media timeout. The Ramblers made their first five shots of the second period and built a 66-49 lead with 16:17 remaining.

It took nearly six minutes, but Missouri State was able to whittle its deficit back to 10 with 10:23 to go after a 3-pointer from Rhodes capped an 11-4 Bears' outburst that made it a 72-62 contest.

But Missouri State would score just four more field goals the remainder of the afternoon, and the Ramblers never took their foot off the gas. LUC would lead by as many as 25 from there, and sent the Bears home with their fifth straight loss.

It was just the third 50-percent shooting effort this season for MSU – its first in conference play – with the Bears dropping in nine 3-pointers, their third-best output from beyond the arc on the year.

Alize Johnson finished with 14 points, 9 rebounds and 5 assists before leaving the game late in the second half on a hard Loyola foul. J.T. Miller tallied 15 points in his return to the starting rotation, and Jarrid Rhodes contributed 11 points.

MSU finished 27-of-53 (.509) from the field, 9-of-21 (.429) from long range and 12-of-16 (.750) from foul line. MSU had 12 turnovers, but dished out 14 assists. Loyola out-rebounded the Bears, 33-22, and padded its lead by producing 14

second-chance points off eight offensive caroms. The Ramblers were 39-of-64 (.609) overall, 10-of-20 (.500) from downtown and 9-of-11 (.818) from the stripe.

Both teams came out smoking from the jump with Missouri State making 68 percent of its shots in the first 20 minutes and Loyola firing at a 64.5 percent clip. The first-half difference was opportunities, which Loyola took full advantage of with eight second-chance points to push the Ramblers ahead 52-43 at the half.

Lawrence drained five first-half 3-pointers and took 17 points into the locker room at the game's midway point.

Missouri State came out of the gates scorching and never looked back in an 81-62 road win over Indiana State.

Alize Johnson led the Bears with 28 points, 8 rebounds, 5 assists and 4 blocks on the night. He also converted 5-of-9 from 3-point range to help Missouri State drop in 11 buckets from bonus distance on the night.

Jarred Dixon added 13 points, Jarrid Rhodes scored 11, and Obediah Church snagged 9 rebounds to help MSU snap a five-game losing streak.

The Bears' 12 blocked shots – including 4 by Tanveer Bhullar – was the most ever by MSU under head coach Paul Lusk and just two shy of the program's record of 14 set in 1990.

Brenton Scott scored 19 for the Sycamores, and Jordan Barnes scored 12. The backcourt tandem knocked down five and four 3-pointers, respectively, for the home side

Missouri State scored the game's first nine points and parlayed that early momentum into a 36-25 halftime advantage.

After a trey by Johnson to start the game, J.T. Miller scored MSU's next six points before the Sycamores got on the board for the first time at the 14:55 mark.

ISU trimmed the Bears' lead to 13-8, but the Bears took off again with seven unanswered points to push ahead by 12 at the midway point of the opening half. A close-range bucket by Church and a 3-pointer by Ryan Kreklow pushed the Bears ahead 20-8

Dixon led another MSU run after back-to-back treys by Barnes got the Sycamores within 20-14. The junior Bear scored on a runner and then kissed the glass with a runner to make it 26-14 at the seven-minute mark, MSU's biggest lead of the first stanza

Rhodes and Dixon would knock down 3-pointers later in the half to give the Bears a 32-21 lead before the under-four media break. Then, Dixon ended his 11-point first half with a layup before the buzzer to give Missouri State an 11-point lead at the intermission.

The second-half started with Mustafa Lawrence scoring the first five points out of the break to give the Bears their biggest lead to that point, 41-25.

Back-to-back triples by Barnes eight minutes into the second half brought Indiana State within 50-42, but a rare four-point play by Johnson followed headed into the 11:21 media timeout, and the Sycamores never got closer than 11 the rest of the way.

The victory gave the Bears a season sweep of ISU for the second straight season.

Led by J.T. Miller's 16 points, Missouri State used solid defense, rebounding and a balanced offensive attack to turn back visiting Evansville, 72-55.

The Bears also got 12 points from freshman Mustafa Lawrence and 11 apiece from Alize Johnson and Jarrid Rhodes. Johnson also added 13 rebounds for his 17th double-double of the year, while Obediah Church matched his career high with 13 boards for MSU.

Missouri State out-rebounded Evansville by a 45-22 margin, the club's second-best rebound margin of the campaign.

Evansville was led by Ryan Taylor's 13 points, while Dru Smith scored 12 for the Purple Aces who were held to just 37.3 percent shooting and 30.8 percent from bonus distance.

Taylor, the MVC's leading scorer, fouled out with just under nine minutes to go, right after his 3-pointer at the 9:39 mark made it a 55-43 contest.

The Bears surrendered just three UE field goals the remainder of the game and used a 12-2 run over a key six-minute stretch late in the game to extend their lead to 23. Miller scored three of his game-high seven field goals in that span to put things out of reach for the Aces.

MSU finished 27-of-59 (.458) from the field and 6-of-21 (.286) from long distance. The Bears were also 12-of-17 (.706) at the foul line with just four turnovers in the second half and 13 for the game. Coach Paul Lusk's squad scored 38 points in the paint and produced 16 second-chance points off 17 offensive caroms.

In the first half, the Bears used a pair of threes by Lawrence to jump out to an 8-2 lead and then used the momentum of a 7-0 run midway through the half to push ahead 21-12. With just over four minutes left in the opening stanza, Evansville went on a 9-2 run that covered three minutes and cut MSU's lead to 26-24. But the Bears responded with an 11-0 run to end the period, including a dunk by Church in the final minute to push MSU ahead 37-24 at the midway point

A pair of free throws by Aaron Cook with 4.1 seconds left in overtime gave Southern Illinois an 81-80 victory over visiting Missouri State.

Missouri State was led by Jarrid Rhodes who pumped in a career-high 21 points behind five 3-pointers, while Alize Johnson secured his 18th double-double of the year with 15 points, 16 rebounds and a game-high 5 assists.

SIU was led by Armon Fletcher's 22 points, while Sean Lloyd produced 21, including 20 in the second half.

MSU had opportunities at the end of regulation and overtime to win the game. Rhodes 3-pointer before the final buzzer at the end of regulation rimmed out to force the extra period. The shot came after the Bears erased a five-point deficit with 3:29 to play.

After Cook's free throws in overtime, MSU got the ball to Jarred Dixon, who scored 15 off the bench for the visitors. He drove all the way to the rim, and Obediah Church grabbed his miss and put it in the basket for what briefly looked like a game-winner for MSU. But a video replay showed Church's put-back came after the horn, giving SIU its seventh straight win in the long-rivaled series.

MSU knocked down 12-of-29 (.414) from 3-point range, including three by freshman Mustafa Lawrence who tallied 11 points. It marked the second-highest 3-point output of the year by MSU.

The Bears were 28-of-62 (.452) overall and made a season-high 92.3 percent at the foul line on 12-of-13 makes. MSU also out-rebounded the Salukis 40-33.

SIU shot 50 percent in the second half to overcome a slow start and finished 31-of-70 (.443) overall and 8-of-19 (.421), including three treys by Marcus Bartley. SIU was 11-of-13 (.846) at the stripe.

In the first half, the Bears drained three 3-pointers in the first five minutes to charge out to a 16-5 lead. MSU would finish the first stanza with a 46.4 percent effort from the field and 7-of-14 performance from beyond the arc.

But the Salukis chipped away, collecting five threes of their own and using a 15-6 run to end the half and go into the intermission leading the Bears, 35-34. Fletcher's desperation jumper at the buzzer banked hard off the glass but found the net to give the home club its first lead of the night.

There were nine ties and 16 lead changes in the contest.

Reed Timmer's desperation 3-pointer from well beyond the arc found its mark with 0.9 seconds to go and lifted visiting Drake past Missouri State, 67-63.

Timmer, who finished with a game-high 20 points, was fouled on the game-winning play and turned it into a rare four-point play to decide the margin of victory.

Missouri State looked to have completed an improbable comeback just moments earlier, rallying from 12 points down in the second half and 10 points down with 9:40 to play to take the lead six minutes later.

After a layup by De'Antae McMurray gave the Bulldogs a 53-43 lead midway through the second half, the Bears went on a 15-2 run over the next seven minutes to take a 58-55 lead. Jarred Dixon and Obediah Church each had five points in that stretch for MSU, while Jarrid Rhodes dropped in a key 3-pointer, and Mustafa Lawrence drained a 15-footer.

Dixon's runner as the shot clock expired with 2:43 remaining gave the Bears a 58-55 advantage, and after Drake snuck in a free throw by Nick McGlynn on its next trip, Church calmly stepped up with a 17-foot jumper to put the home side up by four with under two minutes to play.

McMurray scored with a left-handed layup to bring Drake within two with a minute-and-a-half left, but a solitary free throw by Church pushed MSU's lead back to three, 61-58, by making one of two with under a minute to play.

MSU's Alize Johnson blocked a short jumper by McMurray on Drake's next possession and corralled the rebound – his 16th of the game – and Drake quickly fouled Lawrence with 28.5 to go. The MSU freshman made one of two at the stripe to extend the Bears' lead to 62-58. However, Johnson was called for a foul on the missed free throw which sent Casey Schlatter to the line for two Drake free throws, getting the Bulldogs back within two with no time running off the clock.

Drake quickly fouled Dixon on the next MSU possession, but the 75-percent foul shooter missed both, and with 14.3 seconds to play, Noah Thomas buried a three for Drake to give the visitors a 63-62 lead.

Missouri State decided to attack immediately rather than hold the ball for the final shot and Johnson's drive to the bucket resulted in a Drake foul. However, Johnson was only able to make one of two at the line with 8.1 seconds showing, leaving the game tied for the third and final time.

In the deciding moments, Drake got the ball to Timmer, who lost the handle briefly leaving Rhodes diving on the floor for the loose ball. Timmer recovered between the circles, turned and launched a 35 footer that found its mark with Johnson committing the foul in effort to provide defensive help.

MSU was led by Johnson and J.T. Miller with 14 points apiece, while Lawrence contributed a game-high eight assists, the most by any MSU player this season.

MSU shot a season-low 43.8 percent at the line with 5 misses in the final minute.

On a night dedicated to Missouri State's five seniors, it was junior Jarred Dixon who stole the spotlight. The lanky guard scored a career-high 24 points and dropped in six 3-pointers against a visiting Bradley club that rallied from behind in the final two-and-a-half minutes to defeat the Bears, 82-78.

MSU, which dropped its third straight narrow decision, also got 20 points from senior Jarrid Rhodes, just one shy of his career high. Freshman Mustafa Lawrence added 11 points for the home side.

All five starters scored in double figures for Bradley, including Nate Kennell who scored 20 points behind six treys of his own. The Braves also capitalized on an abundance of foul shots, converting 25-of-31 (.806) at the stripe.

MSU shot 100-percent at the free throw line but got there just nine times.

The see-saw battle featured 19 lead changes and 11 ties, but Bradley's 6-0 run – all from the free throw line – in the final 51 seconds sealed MSU's fate. After Rhodes knocked down two free throws for the Bears with 1:17 remaining to put the home club up by one, Dixon was whistled for a foul on Kennell with 50.7 ticks showing. Kennell made the two free throws to put the Braves up 76-75.

MSU turned it over on its next possession trying to lob the ball inside from the high post and had to foul Darrell Brown. Brown, who was 11-for-12 at the stripe, made both shots to push Bradley up by three.

The Bears called on a timeout with 24.7 seconds left and got the ball to Rhodes for a potential game-tying three, but when his shot missed, MSU had to foul Brown again. Seconds later, BU was up 80-75 after he converted both shots.

Rhodes found his mark with just under six seconds to play, draining his four triple of the night – and the Bears' 13th trey – to make it an 80-78 contest. But with the Bears trying to foul Brown on the ensuing in-bound play, no call was made until the clock had reached 0.9.

Brown made both free throws to ice the win for Bradley just before time expired.

The Bears led by as many as eight in the second half, using four unanswered points from Tanveer Bhullar to push ahead 57-52 at the 11:11 mark before a pair of Dixon buckets rallied Missouri State to a 61-53 advantage with 9:40 to play. Bradley, however, responded with a 12-0 outburst over the next two-and-a-half minutes to retake the lead in what proved to be the most significant run of the contest.

Missouri State shot an impressive 28-for-62 (.452) from the field and 13-for-30 (.433) from 3-point range. The Bears also out-rebounded the Braves by a 34-32 margin and committed just 11 turnovers.

The Bears also tallied 30 bench points and manufactured 12 second-chance points from 10 offensive rebounds.

Bradley made four fewer field goals than the home club, converting 24-of-52 (.462) overall and 9-of-21 (.429) from bonus range.

Missouri State went nearly nine minutes without a field goal midway through the first half to squander an early lead, and host UNI held off a late surge by the Bears in a 71-56 Panthers' victory.

UNI was led by seniors Klint Carlson and Hunter Rhodes with 16 and 13 points, respectively. The Panthers shot 51 percent from the field and made eight threes.

MSU got 14 points from Jarred Dixon, 11 from Jarrid Rhodes and 11 from Alize Johnson, while Obediah Church contributed a career-high 13 rebounds.

After trailing by 14 at the break, MSU came out with a purpose to start the second half, getting a bucket from Johnson, a couple of layups by Dixon and a triple from freshman Mustafa Lawrence to make a dent. Johnson's layup at 15:53 got MSU within 46-36, and Rhodes' layup with 14 minutes to go made it 48-40.

UNI responded with a 5-0 outburst, capped by a Carlson hook shot to push the home side ahead by 13 again, but Dixon's 3-point play and Church's dunk made it 53-45 with 9:21 to go.

Later in the half, Ryan Kreklow drained a 3-pointer from the top of the key to get the Bears within nine. His triple gave him 112 for his career and ties him for 10th on the MSU career list.

With just over six minutes to go, the Bears made their final surge, using a pair of free throws by Kreklow and Rhodes to make it 61-52. But, on UNI's next possession, Rhodes dropped in his third trey of the game to dash MSU's comeback hones.

MSU, which dropped its fourth straight, finished 19-of-52 (.365) from the field, 7-of-21 (.333) from long range and a perfect 11-of-11 (1.000) at the stripe. The Bears also out-rebounded the Panthers by a 30-29 margin and committed just nine turnovers

The Panthers converted 26-of-51 shots with Wyatt Lohaus and Carlson each making 5-of-7. UNI also finished 8-of-21 (.381) from bonus distance and 11-of-12 (.917) at the line with six turnovers.

The first half started well for the visitors as Missouri State led 5-0 out of the gates, 10-6 just three minutes in, and 15-11 after a three by Ross Owens with 13:17 to play in the stanza.

UNI answered Owens' bucket with five straight points by Lohaus to give the Panthers their first lead, but Missouri State responded with a perimeter jumper from Tanveer Bhullar and a triple by Dixon to restore order, 20-16.

But from that point on, the Bears went ice cold from the field, going nearly nine minutes without a bucket and making just one field goal in 15 tries the rest of the half – a three by Jarrid Rhodes at the 1:45 mark. Meanwhile, UNI put together runs of 10-0 and 11-0 to lead by as many as 15 and went into the intermission with a 39-25 advantage.

Missouri State got 22 points from Alize Johnson and 20 from Jarrid Rhodes to turn back Valparaiso, 83-79, in the opening round of the Missouri Valley Conference Tournament.

Johnson also snagged 19 rebounds in the win to set a Bears' Arch Madness record and help Missouri State to a 45-29 advantage on the glass.

League newcomer Valparaiso got a game-high 25 points from Tevonn Walker to lead three Crusaders in double figures.

Missouri State, which never trailed, held off a late rally by Valpo to advance to the Friday's quarterfinal against No. 2 seed Southern Illinois.

The Bears used a 6-0 run over a key stretch midway through the second half to extend a seven-point lead into a 66-53 advantage with 7:49 to play. A pair of baskets by Johnson and a jumper by Jarred Dixon were pivotal on the six-point swing.

But Valparaiso knocked down three 3-pointers in the last five minutes of the game to stay within striking distance. Walker's third triple of the night with 4.3 seconds to play made it an 81-79 game and gave him 22 points in the second half.

But the Bears were solid at the stripe when it counted, going 8-for-8 at the foul line in the final minute with Rhodes making the first four and Ryan Kreklow hitting the last four to ice the win. Kreklow's pair with 3.6 seconds on the clock all but secured victory in the deciding moments and gave him 11 points on the night.

MSU's ninth wire-to-wire victory of the year saw it convert 28-of-64 (.438) shots overall, 7-of-17 (.412) from 3-point range and 20-of-27 (.741) from the foul line. The Bears turned the ball over just eight times and blocked six shots – three by Obediah Church.

Valparaiso finished 25-of-54 (.463) overall from the field and 10-of-18 (.556) from bonus distance. The Crusaders were 19-of-25 (.760) at the stripe and made 15-of-19 in the second half. VU's Bakari Evelyn, who finished with 13 points, missed all three free throws in a pivotal sequence with 2:17 to play and VU trailing by six.

In the first half, the Bears shot 46.9 percent with just two turnovers to lead 39-33 at the midway point. Johnson was near a double-double through 20 minutes with 9 points and 11 rebounds.

Johnson scored all seven Bears' points during a 7-3 run late in the opening half to put MSU ahead 34-27. The Crusaders answered with a 3-pointer by Micah Bradford to get Valpo within four. But then J.T. Miller scored up close, and Rhodes knocked down a corner triple on MSU's next trip to put the Bears up 39-30 with 2:08 left in the half, their biggest lead of the period.

HEAD COACHSeventh Season

M.S.E, Missouri State, 2000 B.S., Southern Illinois, 1995 Hometown - New Baden, Illinois



Paul Lusk is in his seventh season as Missouri State's sideline boss. The former standout player in the Missouri Valley Conference continues to stockpile talent for a proud Bears' basketball program and return it to prominence in the league he grew up in.

In his six seasons on the Springfield campus, Lusk has coached 10 MVC Scholar-Athlete Team selections, five All-MVC players, four All-Freshman Team picks, four members of the MVC All-Newcomer Team and two members of The Valley Most-Improved Team. Lusk, 46, also boasts the MVC Newcomer of the Year each of the past two seasons.

In 2016-17, Lusk and the Bears turned a corner with the club's first winning campaign in three years and a strong run to the MVC Tournament semifinals. MSU was 17-16 overall and 11-6 at JQH Arena with junior transfer Alize Johnson reeling off 17 double-doubles to earn Valley Newcomer of the Year and All-MVC first-team honors. The Bears scored 72.8 points per game in a fan-friendly upturn in offensive production.

The Bears also boasted an MVC All-Defensive Team pick in sophomore Obediah Church -- the club's first since 2011 -- behind his 74 blocks and high-flying rebounds as well as All-Bench Team pick Jarred Dixon. Postseason honors also netted two picks to the Valley Scholar-Athlete Team.

Junior Dequon Miller became the fifth Missouri State player to earn MVC Newcomer of the Year laurels in 2015-16, highlighting a season in which the squad's rookies stole the spotlight. Freshman standouts Obediah Church and Jarred Dixon both earned MVC All-Freshman Team distinction.

The young Bears spent much of Lusk's fifth season battling through injuries and adversity with two of the club's backcourt starters combining to miss 39 games on the injured reserve. However, the Bears showed tremendous resolve, collecting a clutch road win at Oklahoma State, defeating NCAA Tournament sweetheart Northern Iowa at home, and reeling off three straight Valley road wins in the month of January. MSU also finished the season strong, winning four of its last five at home and battling No. 2 seed Evansville to the wire in the second round of the MVC Tournament in St. Louis.

In 2014-15, the Bears managed an 8-6 record at JQH Arena to complete the club's 44th straight season with a winning record at home. The Bears also finished in the top 100 of all Division I programs in home attendance for the 30th straight season. Postseason honors in Lusk's fourth year included a pair of MVC Scholar-Athlete performers. Dorrian Williams was also named to the MVC Most-Improved Team.

Lusk led the Bears to their first 20-win season and postseason appearance of his tenure in 2013-14 with MSU's trip to the Valley Tournament semifinals since 2011 and a CIT first-round appearance.

After his third season in Springfield, Lusk was recognized with distinguished honors. He finished third in the MVC Coach of the Year voting and was named a finalist for the 2014 Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award. The Prosser Award is presented annually to honor those elite coaches who not only achieve success

on the basketball court but who display moral integrity off of it. Lusk's Bears played four top-10 ranked teams in his third season and parlayed that experience into manufacturing the eighth-best turnaround in the NCAA Division I ranks. MSU improved by a +9.0 margin in the span of a year, the third-best improvement in MSU history as well.

Senior Jarmar Gulley earned second-team All-MVC honors in 2014, while classmate Nathan Scheer snagged MVC Scholar-Athlete Team honors for a third straight year. Likewise, Ruder earned MVC All-Freshman team honors after he broke the Bears' freshman 3-point record (72), making him just the fourth freshman in Valley history to score 70 or more long-range shots in a season.

The 2013-14 squad compiled a 20-13 ledger, including a 14-3 mark at home. MSU finished 85th in the final regular-season RPI, making it the highest-rated team to not make the 2014 NIT or NCAA fields.

In 2012-13, Lusk fielded the seventh-youngest team in Division I basketball but led MSU to a winning record at home and the fifth-best turnover average in the nation (10.2). The Bears also set program high-water marks for most games ever against ranked opponents with six and the best single-season scoring total for a freshman class in program history.

The rebuilding campaign saw the young club finish in the NCAA's top 100 in home attendance average. The squad's lone senior Anthony Downing was named All-MVC honorable mention, while Nathan Scheer earned a spot on the MVC All-Bench Team and MVC Scholar-Athlete first team. Christian Kirk was also a postseason honoree with MVC Scholar-Athlete second-team distinction.

The busiest road schedule in school history saw the 2012-13 Bears log 21,373 miles of ground and air miles that included a summer tour of Costa Rica and Thanksgiving trip to Puerto Vallarta, Mexico. After a couple of last-second defeats in the Puerto Vallarta event, the Bears started the MVC schedule with a 3-1 record, including a home win over rival Southern Illinois.

In his debut season at Missouri State in 2011-12, Lusk guided the Bears to a share of third place in the Missouri Valley Conference, tied a school record for most road wins and finished 16-16 overall with arguably the toughest non-conference schedule in the program's history. Close calls and tight finishes became the team's calling card with five overtime games and 17 games decided by single digits. MSU's 12 single-digit losses were the most in the MVC and program's most since 2002.

Lusk's inaugural campaign was also highlighted by a 4-0 start that included one-sided road wins at Nevada and Arkansas State. The Bears began league play with a 12-point win at No. 19 Creighton, the team's first Top 25 win since 2008 and first-ever road win over a ranked opponent. The Bears came within an eyelash of beating Big East power West Virginia in the Las Vegas Classic and also had No. 18 Creighton on the ropes in the final seconds of a home game at JQH Arena in two potential season-changing decisions.

Downing went on to earn a spot on the 2012 MVC All-Newcomer Team, and Michael Bizoukas, a one-year senior transfer from DePaul, led The Valley in



assists and assist-to-turnover ratio. The team's six returning lettermen were also widely publicized in 2011-12 as senior Kyle Weems closed out his career as the program's No. 2 career scorer while earning All-MVC first team honors and becoming a finalist for the Lou Henson Mid-Major National Player of the Year Award. The Bears claimed MVC Newcomer of the Week honors eight times, the second-highest total by one school in league history.

Lusk came to Missouri State after seven seasons as an assistant coach at Purdue. When former Boilermaker associate Cuonzo Martin came to MSU in 2008, Lusk was promoted to associate head coach under top man, Matt Painter, a position Lusk held until coming to Springfield.

During his tenure on the Purdue coaching staff, Lusk helped guide the Boilermakers to five consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances with a collective 129-45 ledger during that span. He first came to West Lafayette in 2004-05 as an assistant under then-coach Gene Keady and stayed on board at Purdue when Painter took the coaching reigns in 2005-06.

Lusk was named by FoxSports.com as one of the nation's top 25 high-major assistant coaches in the summer of 2010. In April 2011, Lusk was inducted into the Illinois Basketball Hall of Fame. After his first year at MSU, CollegeSportsMadness.com named Lusk its 2012 MVC coach of the year after taking the Bears from a predicted sixth-place finish to tie for third.

Before moving to Purdue, he spent one season on Painter's staff at Southern Illinois in 2003-04, a campaign that also culminated in an NCAA Tournament berth, a No. 15 national ranking and a 25-5 record.

Prior to that, he spent one season as head coach at (Division III) University of Dubuque in Iowa. His head coaching debut came on the heels of three seasons at Division II Missouri Southern State in Joplin where he was an assistant under legendary coach Robert Corn. The Lions were 71-21 in that span (1999-2002) with an NCAA Tournament appearance in 1999-2000. His coaching career started with a one-year stint as an assistant at Southwestern Illinois

College in Belleville where coach Jay Harrington's Blue Storm finished 19-12.

The native of New Baden, Ill., began his playing career at lowa in 1990 where he spent two years before he found a home at SIU under coach Rich Herrin. He helped guide the Salukis to three straight NCAA Tournament trips (1993-95), earning All-MVC second-team honors in 1994 with a 15.2 scoring average as a junior. As a senior, he earned a spot on the Valley Scholar-Athlete and All-Tournament teams and finished his career with 1,666 points.

He went on to play professionally both in the United States and Argentina and earned two different invitations to the Phoenix Suns' training camp.

A 1995 graduate of SIU-Carbondale, Lusk and his wife Melanie have a daughter, Maddie, and a son, Jack. The couple both earned their Masters of Science in Education from Missouri State in December 2000.






